TEXT OF OPINION REGARDING MONEY FOR THE LIBRARY

The following is the complete text of the opinion given by District Attorney Keator by Attorney General Brown in regard to the use of city money for the benefit of the county library:

Salem, Ore., May 19, 1917.
Honorable R. I. Keator,
Dist. Atty., Umatilla Co.,
Pendleton, Oregon.

Dear Sir:
I have your favor of the 27th ultimo, in which you ask my opinion whether the city council of The City of Pendleton may contract with the county court of Umatilla county to contribute to the support of the public library owned and operated by said county without violating section 9 of Article XI of the Constitution of Oregon, and setting out the facts which call forth this question. Said section of the Constitution reads as follows:

"No county, city, town or other municipal corporation, by a vote of its citizens or otherwise, shall become a stockholder in any joint stock company, corporation or association whatsoever, or raise money for, or loan its credit to, or in aid of, any such company, corporation, or association."

Section 4348, Lord's Oregon Laws, which is a part of the public library law of Oregon, reads as follows: "If there exists in any incorporated city a secular or nonsectarian library owned and controlled by a society or corporation, the council of such incorporated city may, when deemed best for the interests of the city, levy the tax hereinbefore provided for, and in lieu of supporting and maintaining a public library, enter into a contract with such society or corporation for the purpose of providing the inhabitants of such city with the free use of the library upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the council and the society or corporation; and the terms of such contract may give the control and management of the library to such society or corporation, in which event section 4349 shall have no effect, but the other sections thereof shall be considered to be a part of said contract; that all moneys paid to such society or corporation under said contract shall be expended solely for the maintenance of the library, and for no other purpose."

It is, therefore, evident that the city council has authority to make such contract under the statute unless the same is in violation of the constitutional provision above quoted and in fact they would have such authority independent of the statute, if not prohibited by the Constitution. The Supreme Court of Oregon in the case of Municipal Security Co. vs. Baker County, 39 Ore. 396, at pages 402-7, considered the effect of this provision of the Constitution and its opinion as set forth on said pages is helpful in construing its provisions. Quoting at page 481 from the decision of the Supreme Court of Ohio, as follows:

"... but it (the city) cannot engage in an enterprise with an individual or corporation for the construction or erection of a property which, as a completed whole, is to be owned and controlled in part by the city and in part by an individual corporation."

Our court considering this language says: "We cannot believe that the language of our constitution hereinbefore quoted is susceptible to the construction given to it in a similar clause by the Supreme Court of Ohio, nor yield our consent to the reasons assigned for the decision there rendered."

The court then proceeds to explain that this section of the Constitution was adopted in view of the experience of municipalities of other states taking stock in railroads and other business concerns in order to avoid the disastrous results which followed such investments and that it is not intended to prevent a municipality from owning property jointly with any person, association or corporation, and concludes:

"In the case at bar, if the relief demanded were granted, the county would not thereby become a stockholder in any joint stock company, corporation, or association whatsoever, nor would it be raising money for, or loaning its credit to, or in aid of, any such company, corporation or association."

It may be added that this was a case where the county had purchased certain real property and issued its warrants therefor, but on account of the constitutional limitation upon county indebtedness such warrants were declared invalid and the county was sued to compel it to reconvey the undivided interest in such property represented by the unpaid warrants. In the present instance, the city would not become a stockholder in any corporation, joint stock company or association, nor would it be raising money for or loaning its credit to, or in aid of any such company, corporation or association, as the words are there used.

It has authority to maintain a library, either as the owner thereof or by contract with another to maintain such library and furnish library facilities to its citizens and in either case it does not become a stockholder or contribute in aid of the one furnishing the library facilities. It may in fact be an aid to the county for the city to make such contract but it is also an aid to any person, firm or corporation to furnish any city supplies and it could hardly be held that this is a violation of said section of the Constitution for if so the county would be included from purchasing or contracting for any supplies or service whatsoever and while this is reducing the responsibility to an absurdity, it is not

carrying the theory advanced to its logical conclusion.
