Three more naval recruits have signed up to leave Pendleton in the next few days. Louis James Humbert, an employe of the Eastern Oregon State Hospital, has enlisted as an apprentice seaman. Raiborn Leo Knight as a landsman for yeoman and Percy Jay Burnell of Sanders, Idaho, in the hospital corps.

Schoolmen Take Leave.

Principal H. T. DeWitt of the high school left on No. 17 today for his home in Yamhill. He will attend the N. E. A. convention in Portland and also take summer school work there. Supt. A. T. Park and family will leave in the morning by auto for their homestead in Camas Valley, Idaho. They expect to return by June 12.

High School Boys Enlist.

Sheldon Ulrich, captain of the Pendleton high school football last fall, and Clell Brown, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Brown, both of whom were graduated from the high school last week, have signed up to enter the marine corps and expect to leave tomorrow to take their examinations. If successful they will report at Mare Island, Earl Snyder, captain-elect of the football team for next year, is already in the marine corps.

Manual Instructor Elected.

Paul Amort, for the past year instructor in manual training at Salem high school, has been elected by the Pendleton school board as assistant to R. E. Chlosnek in the manual training department of the Pendleton schools. He will teach the gas engine course, forging and assist in the other work of the department. He was highly recommended by the Oregon Agricultural College for the place made vacant by the resignation of Clarence Tubbs. The board has not

yet selected a new agriculture instructor. An effort will be made to secure one who has specialized in dry farming.

Special Term of Court.

The old jury has been called for a special term of court to begin June 6 to dispose of several cases held over from the regular spring term. Judge Phelps is today calling the docket to prepare for this special term. Immediately after the term, he will leave for Portland to sit on the bench of Judge Davis who is taking training in the officers' reserve camp at San Francisco.

The car had been left standing along the curb in front of the Roosevelt residence and was rammed from the rear. One wheel was broken and the axle badly bent. Civil Service Examinations.

The United States civil Service Commission announces that special first grade clerical examinations for the field service will be held in this city on June 16, 1917, for the purpose of securing eligibles to meet the probable needs of the government service for clerks.

Persons with a knowledge of transportation work, wholesale clothing or grocery business, or financial work, are urged to compete in this examination, as their experience would be valuable to the government at this time.

The usual entrance salary for this position is \$900 or \$1000 per annum. Promotion depends upon demonstrated fitness of persons appointed. Applications and full information regarding examinations may be secured from the Local Secretary, Board of Civil Service Examiners, Post Office Bldg., this city; or from the Secretary, Eleventh Civil Service District, Room 202 Post Office Bldg., Seattle, Wash.

CHICAGO, May 24.—Bids will be opened here June 8 by the quartermaster's department, United States army, for 74,400 automobile trucks and 10,000 motorcycles. Delivery is to be at the call of army officials during 1918.

PEACE MEETING NOT LIKELY TO BRING RESULTS

Outline of Scandinavian Socialists Peace Suggestions Show Agreement is Far Distant.

STOCKHOLM, May 25.—Scandinavian socialists have announced their peace suggestions which include the re-establishment of Belgium, Serbia, Montenegro and Rumania, as separate nations. The future of Alsace-Lorraine is left for settlement on a basis of the national right of free action. The belligerent parliamentary assemblies were requested to work for speedy peace, general disarmament and the establishment of court arbitration. The publication of this outline served to direct attention to the scant likelihood of any sort of an agreement in the socialist deliberations as well as the failure of the plan for a general conference. Bulgarian socialists are demanding Macedonia for Bulgaria, not as an annexation, but as a return for territory rightfully Bulgarian through original ownership. French socialists are not expected here. Austrian, Turkish and Rumanian socialists are not willing to commit themselves on the matter.

IOWA TO HAVE ANOTHER BLUE SUNDAY IS WORD

DES MOINES, Iowa, May 25.—Despite recent acquittals here, Iowa will experience another "blue Sunday," according to an announcement made late today by Attorney General Havener. The attorney general stated that Municipal Judge Meyer's ruling that Sunday baseball and movies were legal would "not in the least" deter him from enforcing the "blue" laws throughout the state next Sunday.

Drug stores, cigar stores and moving picture theaters, meanwhile have announced their intention to remain open in spite of the attorney general's announcement.
