ONE TOWN SUFFERS SERIOUS MATERIAL DAMAGE

LONDON, May 26.-Sixteen German aircraft yesterday made the bloodiest Teutonic air raid since the beginning of the

war, the admiralty announced, with details.

The official casualty lists fix the number of dead at 76, including 27 women and 23 children. The injured number 174, including 43 women and 19 children.

The royal flying corps battled with the invaders while they were crossing England downing three Germans. The naval air service, when the Germans crossed the channel, battled them again. The total German losses are three machines. British Be again.

The raid occurred over the southeast coast. The damage was confined principally to one town.

"Sixteen enemy aircraft bombed the southeast coast last night." Lord French's statement said. "The raid occurred between 5:15 and 6:20. Hombs were dropped in a number of places. The damage was mostly in one town."
