ROCKEFELLER GIVES \$25,000,000
New Donation to Endowment of the Rockefeller Foundation.
NEW YORK, May 25.—A new donation of \$25,000,000 to the endowment of the Rockefeller foundation was announced by Dr. George E. Vincent, formerly president of the University of Minnesota, who assumed the presidency of the board of directors today.
The new gift increases the resources of the foundation to \$125,745,000.
SUFFRAGE TO ALL RUMANIANS.

JASSY, Rumania, May 25.—Premier Bradino has announced to the chamber of deputies that the government requests parliament to insert in the Rumanian constitution the principles of universal suffrage and expropriation in favor of Slav ants. The government is also considering the Jewish question.
