**GERMANY VIRTUALLY IS DECLARING WAR ON LATIN AMERICA**

**Brazil Makes Explanation in Note to Nations of World.**

**RIO DE JANEIRO, June 5.**—Brazil was forced to break her neutrality because Germany virtually is declaring war on all Latin America, according to the formal note of explanation forwarded to all powers except the central powers. Included in the note was a charge that the attitude of certain South American republics "does not comport with the principles of the Monroe Doctrine."
