The scarcity of tin cans caused a decided decrease in tin canned goods and this will enable the home canner glass jars to be put on the market at a profit.

**Can Buy Jars at Cost.**  
Jars are being handled by the Peoples Warehouse and all who wish to can for the market can buy the jars at cost. It is necessary to protect the merchants who have offered to sell the goods in the autumn so those who buy are requested to keep up for the jars and place them for sale in the fall.

**Stores Will Sell Goods.**  
The stores in town have offered to sell the goods and all agree that they should bring good prices. Canned goods have increased double in price in the last six months and indications are that they will continue to rise. The high prices will enable those who can at home to sell their goods at a good profit. One and a half pint jars of vegetables and fruits are selling now at thirty-five and forty cents and according to reports the attractive jars put up by the girls and young women of Pendleton should sell for the same price.
