BABIES TO MEET WAR LOSS
BOSTON, June 11.—A Committee on the Conservation of Child Life was appointed to-day by State Health Commissioner Dr. Allen J. McLaughlin.

"The importance of baby saving," he said, "is accentuated by the loss of man power due to war. Germany demonstrated that, by intensive methods of child conservation, enough lives of babies can be saved above those saved by ordinary methods in times of peace, to replace in a few years the man power because of war."

Drs. David L. Edsall and William J. Galivan of the Public Health Council and Lyman A. Fines, director of the Division of Hygiene in the State Health Department, were named as members of the committee.
