MOB OF MEN AND WOMEN HANG NEGRO IN OKLAHOMA

Wife of Farmer First Identifies Prisoner as the Man Who Attacked Her.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Ok., June 21.—Henry Conly, a negro, was hanged to a tree by mob of 1000 men and women near Holdenville, Ok., late today, after, it is said, he had been identified by Mrs. Jesse L. Burford, wife of a farmer, as the man who had attacked her one week ago today.

Conly was taken to Holdenville early this afternoon from the vicinity of Randolph, where he was captured by a posse after bloodhounds had trailed him almost continually for a week. The train was met at the station by a mob numbering several hundred persons who overpowered his captors and the negro was turned over to a party of men and boys who hurried him across country to the Burford home, near where he was charged with attacking Mrs. Burford while she was alone in a cornfield.
