GENERAL LOWERING OF COAL PRICES IS PROMISED AT ONCE

Cost Per Ton to Be Reduced \$1 and \$1.50 at the Mine and Will Be Followed by Still Further Decreases, as Coal Operators Agree.

WASHINGTON, June 29.—An immediate general reduction of \$1, to \$1.50 a ton in the price of coal at the mine was agreed on today by representatives of the coal operators. This reduction is expected to be price after investigation into the followed by still further decreases in costs of mining coal, and is probable that the government will receive a still lower price than that to the general public.

Hundreds of millions of dollars will be saved to the American people through this decision. The operators agreed to the immediate reduction at a meeting yesterday after adopting a resolution by which coal prices would be fixed with the aid and approval of the secretary of the interior, the federal trade commission and the committee on coal production of the national defense council.

600,000,000 Tons Mined Yearly.
About 600,000,000 tons of coal were mined in this country last year and Secretary Lane, who has earnestly urged a reduction, believes that the saving to the American people will be enormous.

After hearing of the operators' action, Mr. Lane wrote the following letter to P. S. Peabody, chairman of the coal production committee, who has been in constant conference with the operators:

"I have just learned of the action of the coal operators and I wish to express my appreciation of the generous, prompt and patriotic manner in which they have acted. They have dealt with the situation in the way that I had hoped they would as large men dealing with a large question. The agreement on price reduction is understood to relate to bituminous coal."

Reduction Asked by Lane.

Secretary Lane had previously sent the conference a letter asking immediate action in reducing the price. The tentative prices fixed to continue until the investigation into costs and conditions warranted an increase of reduction in the tentative prices. He suggested that the tentative fixing of prices should not affect present contracts of export trade.

Creation of a national association of coal operators, with a central bureau at Washington, for standardizing statistical and other information relating to coal production, marketing and other matters, was agreed to by the conference. It will be made up of the various state and district coal associations and will serve as an intermediary for information between the coal operators and the government.

That systematic effort to cut down the cumbersome delivery systems in order to release men may eventually bring forward the market basket as a symbol of patriotism.

and his lecture was both entertaining and helpful.
Dr. Broucher mingled the serious with the light and humorous. His cells stories like a rapid-fire gun. He keeps his audience in good humor and then shoots his 42-centimeter gaug of good hard common sense. In brief the serious part of his theme was this: You should spend more time correcting your own faults than those of your neighbors. God only made one clean and healthy; it is a crime to be sick; keep your mind active, alert and full of clean thoughts; be bright, be courageous, be optimistic, do something; leave scandal, gossip, evil thoughts alone; fill your mind with the things of joy and gladness instead of gloom and the gutter; make your own character better; be full of pep, have something under your hat and exercise it.
In introducing his subject, which was "What's Under Your Hat," he said that his lecture was a sermon "on a spruce."
"We have mastered everything but kept ourselves," he declared. "The world has better things today than at the time of our fathers, but do our express trains carry better beer and women to the coast than the ox carts did? If you are not better than your father, if your son is not better than you, your family will come out at the small end of the horn."
"You are responsible for what you have under your hat. Any man who like Adam, blames a woman, is a sneak. The Almighty made woman to equal man. Eve blamed the snake. The snake blamed the devil, and so we are prone to take all the praise to ourselves and to put the blame on others. Yet we are at fault if we are not what we ought to be."
The lecture was well received and many stayed to meet Dr. Broucher after he had concluded.
