#### Navy Filled On Aviators.

The aviation branch of the navy is filled for the time being and no more enlistments will be made for the time being, according to instructions received by Recruiting Officer Swartz. No more plumbers or fitters are wanted at this time but there is still a need of second class ship-lifters.

#### Vacation On Motorcycle.

Sidney Morton and his sister, Miss Florence Morton, left this morning on a motorcycle on a vacation of several weeks into central Oregon. They will go to Bend by way of Heppner and will be joined there by their brother, Charles Morton, and other relatives and go to Shettle Lake for an outing. Returning they will come by way of Portland.

#### Recruiting for Signal Corps.

Corporal Frank Harvey of the local army recruiting office this morning received instructions to accept recruits for the signal corps. Besides regular qualifications for military service, the recruit must be a cable, telegraph or radio operator, inside or outside wireman, electrician, machinist, photographer, or familiar with the construction and maintenance of a telephone system. There are 1600 vacancies in the corps.

#### Want Rev. Gornall Returned.

The congregation of the Methodist church wants to retain Rev. R. E. Gornall as pastor. At the last business meeting of the summer held on Friday evening, it was voted unanimously to ask the conference, which meets in September, to return Rev. Gornall here for another year. The minister has been in the city only a year but in that time has become very popular with his congregation.

#### Married 29 Years; Seeks Divorce.

After being married to W. A. Kutch for 29 years, Josie Kutch has brought suit in the local court for a divorce, alleging that for 23 years her husband has constantly annoyed and harassed her by false accusations, abuse and physical ill-treatment. She asks for the custody of three minor children and a one-third interest in her husband's farm land. S. D. Peterson is representing her. They were married in Baker in 1888.

#### Fishing good in Spots.

There were hordes of fishermen on the streams of Umatilla county yesterday but the majority of them brought back only a few fish. The Umatilla river from Thorn Hollow to the forks was lined with anglers but the majority did not have any luck. Charles Alpbach, who went up with Dean Long came back this morning with a dozen or more over a foot long. John and Brooke Dickson made a trip early in the morning to Desolation creek a distance of 75 miles, but found too much water for good sport.

A new domestic heater installed at the Eastern Oregon State Hospital doubles the capacity of the hot water plant for the institution, thus amply providing for the needs of the new wing. Before the new heater was secured the old plant was scarcely equal to the task of

supplying the enlarged institution. The hospital has also secured a portable 20 horse power oil engine for use in pumping water to high points of land and for cutting corn and hay.
