Seattle Builders Sell Partially Completed Steamers.

SEATTLE, July 12.—The Skinner & Eddy Shipbuilding corporation today sold two partially constructed 8800-ton steel steamers to Japanese interests, believed to be Mitsui & Co., among the largest shipping concerns operating on the Pacific. One of the vessels, the Martha Washington, will be launched late this month and the other, the J. H. Fox, will follow in August.
