BRUCE HALDEMAN WINS SUIT INVOLVING HENRY WATTERSON

Court Upholds Denied Agreement, Suggesting That Editor had "Forgotten" Acquiescing in It.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., July 21.—An injunction was granted here today in the chancery court to Bruce Haldeman, president of the Louisville Courier Journal and Louisville Times companies, restraining W. B. Haldeman, Daniel Haldeman and Bennett H. Young, directors, and the corporations themselves from taking steps to remove him from his post as business manager of the two papers.

Henry Watterson, who appeared in the case as an intervening petitioner on the side of the defendants, denied acquiescence in an agreement entered into by members of the Haldeman family vesting management of the two papers in Bruce Haldeman as president and business manager, and assenting to W. B. Haldeman a place as vice president or as a director.
