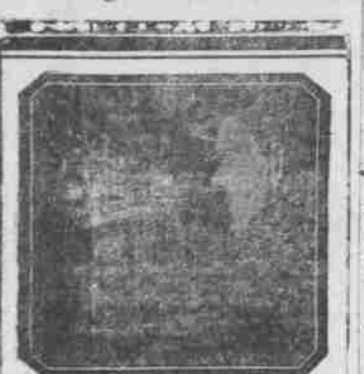
RED CROSS WORK.

FORTUNATE MEN

It is sad that a peace loving republic such as the United States must call its men to the fighting line as is now being done under the compulsory service law. But there is reason for this action. Our direct reasons for being at war are found:

In the policy of the German autocracy in sinking our ships on the high seas, unarmed and

peaceful, without warning and without giving passengers and crew a chance to escape.

In resuming such a policy of ruthlessness after having officially informed our government such work would not be done.

In plotting to destroy industries and kill American citizens in this country when we were at peace with Germany and desired to so remain.

In plotting by chicanery and falsehood to get Mexico and Japan to invade our peaceful western states and by holding out a promise of American territory for the invaders.

Indirectly we have occasion for war because of the cold blooded invasion of Belgium in defiance of treaty and the despoliation of that land. There is cause of war in the slaughter of innocent Belgian civilians and the cruel, inhuman maiming of little children.

We have direct cause for war in the fact that if we do not aid now in the overthrow of kaiserism the time will come when single handed we will have to face a foe that has already made the boast that he will make America pay tribute in the form of a huge indemnity to Berlin.

The men drawn for service yesterday are fortunate in that they are selected to represent this country on the battlefield in a war for humanity and freedom. Let them face their obligations with bold hearts and good cheer. There are many millions more ready to follow them when the time comes.

THE MICHAELIS SPEECH

THE defiant tone of the new German chancellor is nothing less than might have been expected. German autocracy knows there can be no peace except on a basis of autocracy's downfall. Word to that effect has been served by the allied nations. We fight not merely to end the war but to provide post bellum conditions that will make future peace an assurance and experience shows that the peace of the world is not safe while the central powers are dominated by a caste that places sole faith in militarism and is inspired by a philosophy under which no regard is shown for the rights of man or the laws of God.

Knowing the nature of the allied goal the kaiser has no course save to abdicate or fight to a finish. He will fight as long as he can. But there will be a limit to German endurance and a limit to Teutonic forbearance in conducting a war that is not for the German people but for men who in truth are their oppressors. When that day arrives William will be fortunate if he does not find more formidable foes at home than in the ring of allied soldiers surrounding his empire.

It is significant that the German socialists do not approve of Michaelis. They realize that his policy is to win or sink the ship. How long will they stand for such a commander?

A CASE FOR THE CLOTURE

THE house was so generally convinced of the importance of an overwhelming army of aeroplanes in prosecuting the war against Germany that it debated the \$640,000,000 aviation bill only five hours and then rushed it into the senate. The senate military affairs committee is so impressed the same way that it orders a favorable report after 45 minutes of discussion and the road appeared to be wide open for getting the bill to the President by tonight.

But it is now seen that the road just ahead is beset by certain obstructive senators. They are of the senators who tried to disarm the United States in venturing to assert its rights on the high seas against Germany. They are of those who have before in effect acted as allies of the kaiser, if they have not plainly spoken in such a capacity.

What moves them now to obstruct in the very face of the enemy we do not know. It may be the news from Germany that Zeppelin construction has been dropped and all its energy given to aeroplane building in anticipation of the American effort. It may be something else. But the effect is to give the enemy a start against their own country.

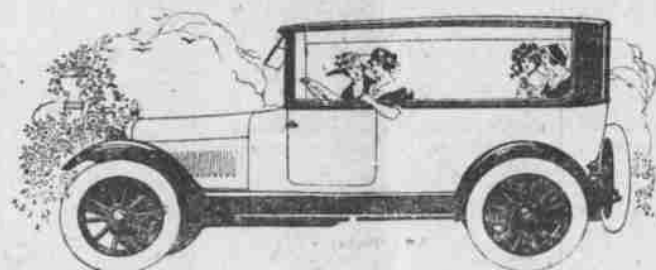

LIQUOR FOR PERSONAL USE FORBIDDEN IN DRY TERRITORY

Cannot Be Carried in Private Conveyance or in Baggage. Department of Justice Rules.

WASHINGTON, July 19.—Every form of liquor transportation into dry territory is forbidden whether on the person, by common carrier, by private conveyance or in baggage, according to instructions sent United States attorneys throughout the country by the department of justice.
