Howard's loss was 11 men killed and 24 wounded, among the latter were Captain Baurost and Lieut. Charles Williams. Joseph lost 12 good Indians dead on the field. He wounded numbered 22. Joseph retreated to Canine prairie.

We stop the press to announce that Walters' sometimes called old Nicks' land of Columbia's river Indians have broken out on Butte creek. When Major Conyner left Umatilla yesterday 18 families had sought safety in flight to that point.

AMSTERDAM, July 18.—The great German industrial town of Essen, where the Krupp gun works are located, was raided again by allied aviators on Saturday night.

This information was contained in a dispatch from the frontier.

The telegram added that the bombardment was followed by tremendous explosions.

**NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT.**  
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, held on July 18, 1917, the following resolutions were duly adopted:

Whereas, The City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 18th day of July, 1917, under direction and by appointment of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton plans and specifications for the improvement of the following named street in said city, viz: College Street from the North line of Court Street to the South line of Court Street, together with the estimate of the cost thereof, with a statement of the probable cost thereof, together with an estimate of the benefits to be derived from such improvement, and the percentage of the total cost of such improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay as an account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement; and

Whereas, The Common Council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work; and

Whereas, The property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is, in the judgment of the Common Council, property to be included within such improvement district, and no property is excluded therefrom, which should properly be included therein; and

Whereas, The improvement of the herein above described portions of College Street from the North line of Court Street to the South line of Court Street, by paving the same with gravel bituminous pavement, such pavement to be 24 feet wide between gutters and surface thereof to be finished upon the established grade of such street and all other things in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications of the improvement of said portion of College Street, prepared by George Kimbrell, City Surveyor of said city, in the sum of \$1736.70 and were filed with the Recorder of said city on the 18th day of July, 1917, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to and are adopted and approved, and it is further

Resolved, That the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be assessed therefor, and it is further

Resolved, That an assessment district is hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 52," embracing the property benefited and to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which assessment district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

DESCRIPTION OF ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 52, (sometimes called "Local Improvement District No. 52")

Commencing at the Southwest corner of Lot 7, Block 28, Reservation Addition to the town, now City of Pendleton, Oregon, thence North 23 deg. 26 min. West 350 ft. to the North line of Court Street; thence North 60 deg. 24 min. East 200 ft. to the Northeast corner of Lot 14, Block 1, Arnold and Exley Addition to the town, now City of Pendleton, Oregon; thence North 23 deg. 26 min. West 350 ft. to the North line of Alta Street; thence East 60 deg. 24 min. West 200 ft. to the place of beginning.

And be it further Resolved, That a copy of this resolution together with the notice that the surveyor's estimate of the percentage of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land is on file in the office of the City Recorder in the East Oregonian, which newspaper is hereby designated by the Common Council for the publication thereof.
