Resolved, That the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvements and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, so specially benefited by such improvements shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be it further

Resolved, That an assessment district be hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 56," embracing the property benefited and to be assessed for the payment of such improvement, which assessment district shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

DESCRIPTION OF ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 56 (sometimes called Local Improvement District No. 56). Commencing at the Southwest corner of Lot 6 Block 9, Original Town of Pendleton; thence S. 23 deg. 36 min. W. 200 ft. to the Northwest corner of Lot 1 of said Block 9, thence N. 08 deg. 24 min. E. 200 ft. to the Northeast corner of Lot 1, thence S. 23 deg. 36 min. W. 200 ft. to the Southwest corner of Lot 2 of said Block 9, thence S. 24 deg. 24 min. W. 200 ft. to the place of beginning.
