SEATTLE CAR STRIKE ENDS AFTER 16 DAYS

SEATTLE, Aug. 2.—Sixteen hundred striking streetcar employees returned to work this morning, giving Seattle a street car service for the first time in 16 days. No excitement accompanied the return to work. The employees have won practically every big issue, including union recognition. Six hundred imported strike-breakers are being shipped eastward. Tacoma street car men have also returned to work.

NO CHEAP BREAD IF 82 WHEAT

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—In a communication to congressional conferees on the food bill the war emergency council of the baking industry today gave notice that the 12 minimum for wheat proposed by the bill would permit or no reduction in the present price of bread. The council urged that the price of wheat be left to the food administration and pointed out that only 5 per cent of the people of the United States were interested in a high price for wheat, while 95 per cent was interested in a reasonable price for bread. The council sees no immediate prospect for reduction in bread prices.

Congress ought to forget its own importance and buckle down to the work of fighting this war to a finish.
