BONES REPAIRED SO THAT WOUNDED CAN FIGHT AGAIN

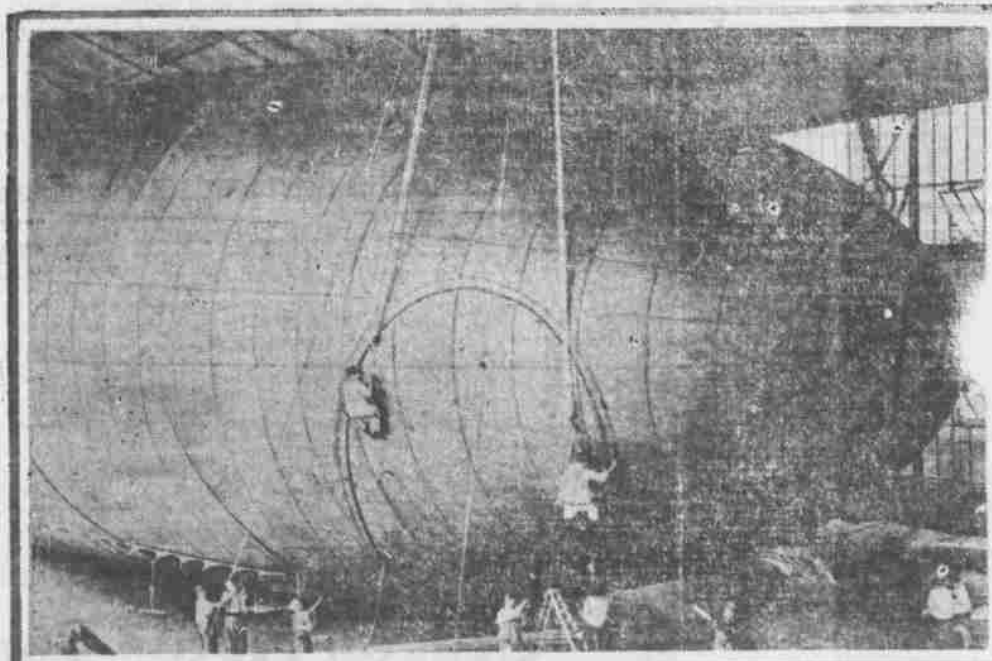
AN ATLANTIC PORT, Aug. 11.—Out of one detail of 1350 wounded soldiers sent for special treatment to a London hospital suffering from crushed and broken bones 1000 were able to return to active duty at the front, according to Maj. J. E. Gold, who arrived here today from Europe. Major Gold is one of twenty American medical officers who have been in France and England observing and studying new methods of treating wounded. He has returned to the United States to recruit surgeons who could be given the advantage of similar study in order that the American army when it gets into action, may have the benefit of modern treatment.

TO CLOSE RUSSIA AGAINST OUR IMPORTS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—The Russian embassy is to issue orders tomorrow to its consular agents restricting imports from the United States to Russia, the embassy announced. This is a step in the extension of the Russian government's restrictions on passports to Russia from the United States thus closing the Russian frontier.

OREGON COPPER WIELD INCREASED 800 PER CT.

Homestead Iron Dyke Mine in Baker County Big Yielder.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 11.—Although the receipts from Oregon at the mint and smelters at San Francisco show a falling off in output of gold for that state of some \$75,000 for the first five months of 1917, as compared with the corresponding period of 1916, it is not an indication according to Shaw G. Yale of the United States Geological Survey, Department of the Interior, that the mines, as a whole are less prosperous this year than last. It may be stated, as confirming this opinion, that aside from the increase in gold and silver in 1915, as compared with 1914, the copper output of the State increased 794 per cent, so that the total metal yield of Oregon in 1915 increased \$29,969 or 47 per cent, as compared with 1914. A steady increase of copper yield is apparent in 1917, and the placer mines are also increasing the gold yield, although the deep mines are not producing so much gold as in 1916. As the copper output is augmented, so is that of silver.

It was not until 1915 that the Homestead Iron Dyke mine in Baker County was reopened after years of idleness, and is now by far the largest copper and silver producer in the state. In June of this year a new body of ore has been discovered in the 450 level of the mine. A large concentrator has been constructed, and the flotation process is used. Other important deep mine producers in Baker County are the Baker Mines Company and Cornucopia Mines Company in Cornucopia district; and the Commercial Mining Company, in Mormon Basin district. The largest placer producers in the county (and the State) is the Powder River Dredge Company, operating two dredges in Cracker Creek district, and having a very prosperous season. The Laclede mine, near Baker, has been reopened this year; and the old Ben Harrison mine, at Sumpter, once a large producer, has been sold to Idaho men, who intend making extensive developments.

There are not many changes to be noted in the mining situation in south western Oregon in 1917. The old Blanco beach sand deposit in Curry County, between Port Orford and Langlais is being equipped with new machinery to treat 500 tons of gold platinum sands daily. The Nellie Wright mine, near Gold Hill, Jackson County, was recently sold to Salt Lake men, who are installing compressors and drills. The mine has a 250-ton Beers mill. The Cheney, Simon, Ray and Huff group of quartz claims, in the same county, has been sold to Sacramento, California people who are starting a new 1200 foot adit.

In Josephine County the Grayback copper group, in Waldo district, has been leased to owners of the Culford, not-Oregon Coast R. R., who also own the Queen of Bronze and the smelter at Takilma, and development work on a large scale has commenced. The Queen of Bronze is this year working 60 men and producing a good grade of copper ore. It is expected that several of the old mines in Bohemia district, near Cottage Grove, will be reopened this year. GERMAN INSURANCE HELD TO BE RISKY

Assets of Fire Concerns Mainly in Imperial Bonds, U. S. Experts Estimate.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—Government experts familiar with the activities of German fire insurance companies operating in this country estimate that \$2,000,000 out of their \$8,000,000 in assets are invested in bonds of the Imperial German government.

Because of the probability that the German government will be virtually bankrupt at the end of the war, the government experts feel that good business alone should prompt Americans to change their policies as rapidly as possible to solvent American concerns. They assume that the companies would be unable to meet any great demands because of the nature of their investments.
