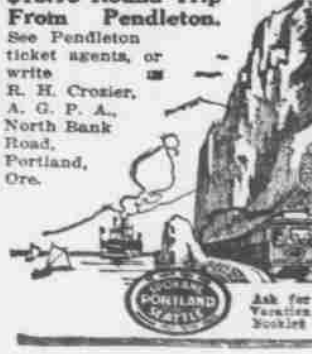

SIX CAPTURED FROM STEAMER CAMPANA

Captain of Ship and 5 Gunners are German Prisoners.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—Five American gunners, instead of four and the captain of the Campana were made prisoners when the vessel was

submerged, the navy department has learned officially.

Those imprisoned were James Delaney, chief gunners' mate; William Miller, second class seaman; Frederick Jacob, second class seaman; Ray Roop, boatswain's mate; Charles Kline, gunners' mate, third class; Captain Oliver, master of the Campana. Eight other members of the armed guard landed at a French port.

EXCHANGE EXPELS GAMBLERS IN EGGS

Chicago Firm's Affidavit That Deal Was Speculative Causes Action.

CHICAGO, Aug. 15.—One of the big South-Water street commission firms, Morgan, Kuhn & Co., was expelled today from the Chicago Butter and Egg Board.

According to evidence submitted the firm sold to the Davis Kilbourne Company five cars of April eggs, which they failed to deliver. When sued for delivery, Morgan, Kuhn & Co. submitted an affidavit stating that the sale was purely speculative and that they had no intention of making the delivery.

Directors of the board, when apprised of the sense of the affidavit, immediately voted to expel. Threats of injunction are made against the board but the directors say the rules against gambling are explicit.
