DEPALMA WINS THREE RACES AT SHEEPSHEAD

Takes Thirty, Twenty and Fifty Mile Events; Chevrolet Second in Two.

SHEEPSHEAD BAY, N. Y., Aug. 21.—Alph DePalma won all three of the three-cornered automobile races over Sheepshead Bay speedway track today at distances of thirty, twenty and fifty miles. Louis Chevrolet finished second in the first two events, but after being compelled to stop twice to change tires he withdrew from the third contest.

Barney Oldfield, the veteran speed king, experienced considerable difficulty with engine of his "Golden Submarine" and after racing a couple of laps in the first two events was practically out of each contest, although he continued to go around the track until both races were completed.

DePalma's time for the thirty miles was 16:25 3-5; for the twenty miles 10:53 4-5, an average of 110 1-5 miles an hour and for fifty miles 27:22 1-4.
