WHO'S WHO IN THE WORLD SERIES



CHARLES HERZOG.

Charles L. (Buck) Herzog was born at Baltimore, July 9, 1883, and played his first baseball in organized ranks with York and Reading in the Tri-State League, after graduating from the University of Maryland. He started out as a third baseman, but has played every position around the edge of the infield except first base. His first came to the Giants in 1905, but was used as a substitute and got into fifty-nine games. The following year he played through the spring training games with McGraw's club and showed so much aggressive spirit that "Mugs" kept him all season.

In 1910 he went to Boston, and continued with the Braves until July of 1911, when McGraw traded Groulx and Herzog for him. He stuck with New York until 1914 and was transferred to Cincinnati in the bescher deal. The following year he was made manager of the Reds and continued in that capacity until July 29, 1916, when McGraw pulled off the big deal which sent Mathewson to "Cincy" and brought the veteran Herzog back into the giant fold.

Having disposed of Lavy, Day's, McGraw had to have a second baseman and Herzog was assigned to the keystone sack. Though he had spent six years previously on the other side of the diamond, playing short and third, "Buck" soon brushed up on the job, and this season finds him playing second with the skill of a finished artist.

PRO-GERMANS IN IOWA AIR TOLD TO BE GOOD

CEDAR RAPIDS, Ia., Aug. 22.—For the last four days federal marshals have been going through the hordes of pro-Germanism in Iowa, singling out the leaders, assembling them on the public squares and in the presence of a majority of the townsfolk, sternly lecturing them on their duties to this government, and warning them if there are any further complaints of disloyalty they will be either held for the federal grand jury or interned during the war.

Fifteen towns in Benton, Cedar, Tama and Linn counties were visited this week. In most instances good results were obtained, but in one or two towns Germans were sullen and apparently resented the marshals' advice.
