EARLY PIONEERS PLAN TO BE IN WALLA WALLA
 Will Make Special Effort to Attend Pow-wow According to Letters.
 WALLA WALLA, Sept. 10.—Early pioneers of this inter-mountain country, now scattered over the northwest, will make a special effort to be in Walla Walla for the first annual Pow-wow, Sept. 12, 14 and 15, according to letters received from many of them.
 The pioneers' cabin at the fair grounds, erected by the early settlers principally at the instigation of the late W. P. Winans, will be headquarters. Here will be displayed the treasured relics of the pioneers: old utensils, books, weapons, implements, fancy work, etc., and here will gather the pioneers to sit around the campfire and retell the story of their lives in this vicinity before Walla Walla was anything but a village.
 There is hardly an early settler in the northwest who at some time did not live in or visit Walla Walla, which was then the principal trading point. Here came the miners to try their luck at gambling or in other primitive "good-time ways" now frowned on. Here came the stock raisers and early farmers and here, in fact, came everybody in the early days.
 There are so many of the men and women who were here at that time, now living in the northwest, that it is believed there will be an unusually large attendance this year. Every effort will be made to entertain them. The younger generation will not be neglected. The whole show is being prepared with a view to pleasing the greatest number.
