The dance will be a lit-up affair, the dancers paying only for what they dance. The floor has been cleaned and the big pavilion put in shape for the big crowd which will undoubtedly be at hand.

For Red Cross Study.
Registration for the Red Cross class work to be taken up here October 1 is to begin tomorrow and those desiring to register for this work may do so at the Red Cross headquarters in the library. Two classes are contemplated one in dietetics by Mrs. C. H. Marsh, and a class in elementary hygiene and home care of the sick by Mrs. Martha M. Thompson. The membership in the classes will be limited and those registering first will be taken.

Faulty Contract Delays Bridges.
The changing of the contract for the building of the two steel bridges across the Umatilla river on the reservation is responsible for the delay in the starting of those structures, according to a letter received by Supt. E. L. Swartzlander from E. B. Merritt, assistant Indian commissioner. The contract was let June 25, 1917, to the Monarch Engineering Co. of Denver and the contract paper mailed.

Hotfoot Is Hurt.
Hotfoot, the popular little black Round-Up buckler, sustained an injury this morning while being exercised. A splinter, quite long, from a fence entered his body back of the foreleg. The splinter was extracted and the little "cattle walker" will probably not be barred from the bucking contest by the accident.

Buffalo Vernon Arrives.
Buffalo Vernon, well known cowboy who has been a favorite in past Round-Ups, arrived in Pendleton last evening from Colorado and will enter in the bulldozing and steer roping events next week. Vernon declares he is "fit as a fiddle and rarin' to go." He was accompanied by several other cowboys of the middle west.

32 Out of 161 Rejected.
A total of 32 men out of the first 161 called from this county have been rejected for physical disability and their names were sent in last night by the local board to the district board. Out of the list there were 11 enlistments, leaving 118 from which to pick the quota of 12. The local board is meeting this afternoon to clean up all cases still pending.

Alleged Deerslayer Taken.
Deputy Game Warden Tonkin yesterday went into Franklin county, Washington, and took into custody Jesse Schell, charged with killing deer out of season in the east end of the county last winter. Upon the advice of an attorney, he waived extradition. He was arraigned today before Justice of the Peace Parkes but has not entered a plea yet.

Nine More Enlist.
The local exemption board today received notification from the adjutant general of the enlistment of the following men registered in Umatilla county: Harold Brock, Louis E. Comstock, Ben F. Irish, Frank A. Hines, Robert E. Hobbs, Ben Twombly, Lester Marlon Martin, Hiel A. Hyde and Adelbert A. Landis Brock, who is the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Brock of this city, has enlisted in the naval coast defense reserve at the Puget Sound Navy Yards.

Predict Use of Substitute Bread.
CHICAGO, Sept. 14.—Grain experts believe that Americans, especially in the east will be eating rye, corn and even oatmeal bread exclusively before the wheat flour shortage is adjusted. The flour demand is very urgent in the east and other parts of the country will soon feel the pinch, it is declared. Experts predict that farmers will begin to sell wheat soon with a consequent elimination of the flour shortage.

One Mill Closes.
MINNEAPOLIS, Sept. 14.—With one small mill closed because of the wheat shortage, wheat receipts jumped back to normal when 452 cars arrived in the Minneapolis yards. Millers believe the shortage is only temporary.

STOCKHOLM, Sept. 14.—Oscar Werjof, first secretary of the foreign office, has been dismissed from service.

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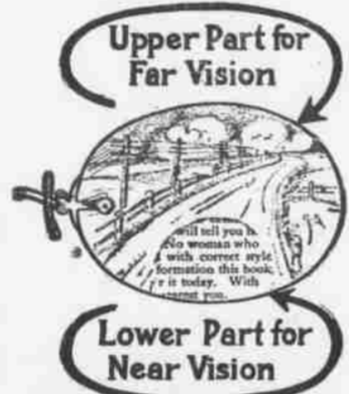
