

Umatilla County Did Not Look Good to I. W. W.

"Leave this Pendleton town alone. These damn buckaroos would just as soon rope a feller and bulldoze him."

This was the very terse and impressive advice handed out by an I. W. W. organizer to one who he thought belonged to the same organization but who was in reality a detective sent to Pendleton by the state fire marshal to check up on I. W. W. activities.

That remark explains why Umatilla county, though the banner wheat county of the northwest, was not mentioned at all during her big harvest season by the trouble-making "I. W. W. Works". Originally this county was scheduled by the I. W. W. organizers for a tie-up, according to information from state authorities, but the plan was abandoned when an investigation showed a sentiment not to be aroused.

Several I. W. W.s came here early in the summer to look over the situation with a view to organizing farm hands and interfering with the harvest operations. It was about this time that state secret service men, bearing I. W. W. cards and looking as rough as old clothes and face-stub, could make them, arrived on the scene and began fraternizing with the trouble-makers. They learned that the courage of the organizers had begun to wane at sight of the buckaroos around town and that they were leaving for fields where their endeavors would not likely meet with rough opposition.

An investigation by the state agents convinced them that the fears of the I. W. W.s were well-founded. They found farmers and farm hands as well as cowboys ready to take the law in their own hands should anything be started that would threaten a tie-up of harvest. The presence of Troop D in the city constituted a further menace. Recruited largely from cowboys the troop wanted lively action and the members didn't want to wait until they reached France for some fun.

One recalcitrant, who muttered some uncomplimentary remarks about the troopers and who manifested other I. W. W. sympathies was roundly kicked and cuffed and turned over to the sheriff who kept him for a few weeks where he was safe from all harm.

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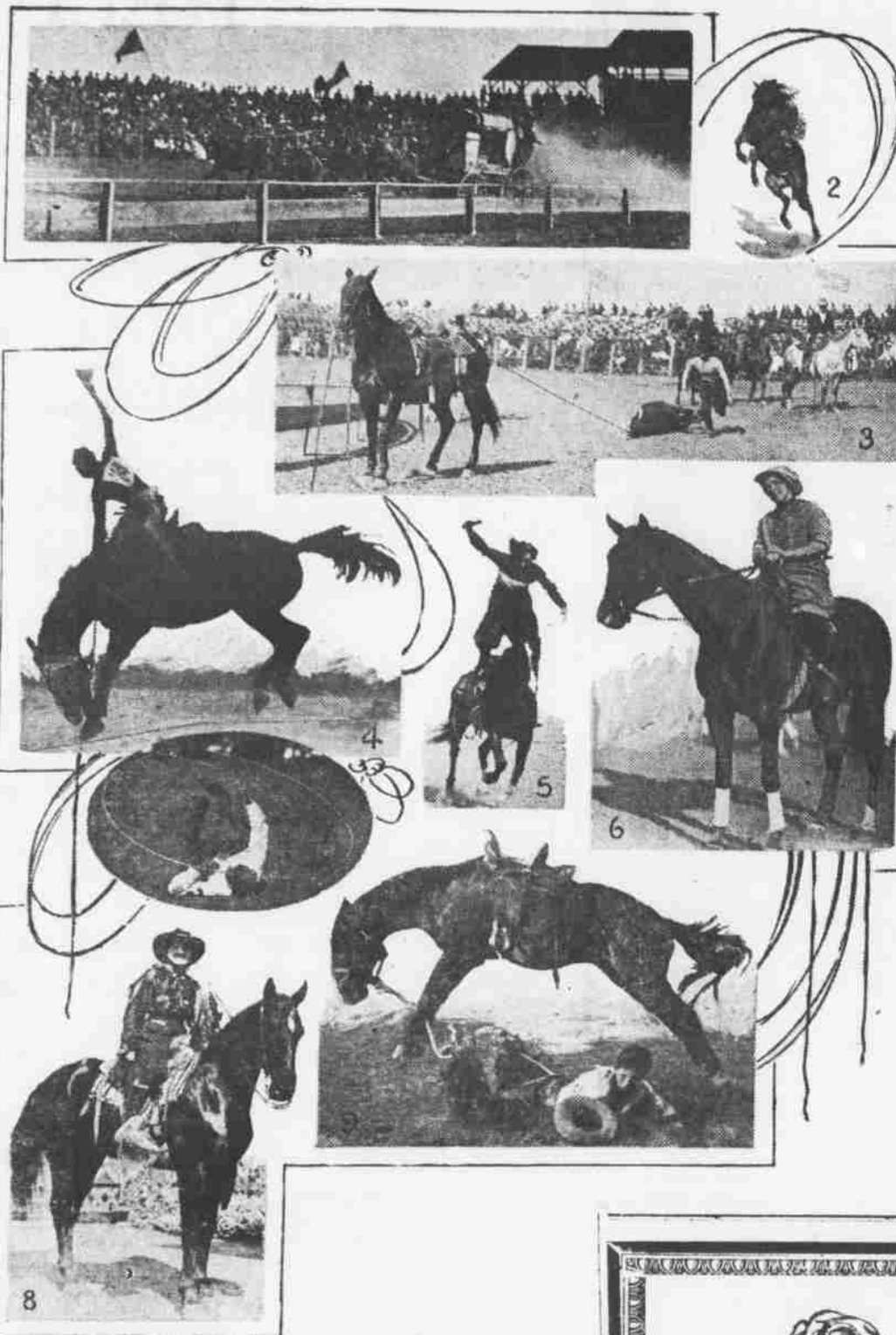
