



1914 the imports from Greania were \$42,144,295; in 1916, \$96,125,991 and in 1917, \$65,328,379. Imports from Africa in 1917 gained 213 per cent over 1914. They amounted to only \$19,149,476 in 1914 as against \$64,765,745 in 1916, and \$60,913,316 in

Of North American countries Canada showed the greatest gain in the 1911 imports as compared with those of 1914. The increase amounted to \$150,000,000 and was due to large imports of wheat copper, paper, beards and wood guip. Imports from Cuba gained \$122,000,000, owing chiefly to the riso in the value of sugar, which increased from \$95,594,782 in 1914 to \$294,521,140 in 1917, although the quantity decreased from \$.926,506,243 to 4,568,079,208 pounds in the same period.

Imports from Argentina increased by over \$100,000,000 in value, chiefly in word and hides. Imports from \$25,750,000 in \$134, to \$114,758,000 in \$181, a sain of \$350 per cent, chiefly in nitrate of soda, copper and tin. Imports from Brazil in \$1:17 showed a gain over \$1814 of \$51,600,000 principally in coffee, hides, rubber and magazinese.

Imports from China increased by more than \$60,000,000 chiefly in hides, sik and wool; while imports from the Japanese leased territors in China, which amounted to only \$230,000 in 1914, rose to \$5,000,000 in 1917, representing principally oya-bean oil. Imports from the British East Indies increased from \$112,000,000 in 1913 to \$217,500,000 in 1917, the gain being chiefly in burlaps, hides, rubber and tin. Imports from Japan increased from \$107,300,000 in 1914 to \$2205,000,000 in 1917, more than half of the increase being in raw silk. Imports from the Philispines increased from \$18,125,000 in 1914 to \$42,500,000 in 1917, the gain being in manila hemp sugar coters and cosonity oil.
