FOREST REGIMENT RECRUITS WANTED

TWENTIETH REGIMENT OF ENGINEERS AFTER TWO BATTALIONS OF LOGGERS AND LUMBERMEN.

PORTLAND, Sept. 22.—At the request of the war department the forester has designated Geo. H. Cecil, district forester, Portland, Oregon, to assist in recruiting two battalions of loggers and lumbermen, as part of a second forest regiment which will be known as the 20th engineers (forest) regiment. Each battalion will consist of three companies of 250 men each, all of whom should be experienced loggers or mill men. Special request has been made for a limited number of men especially qualified for sawyers, sawmill engineers, filers, ratchet setters, millwrights, electricians, edgermen, foremen, woods bosses and motor truck operators. Information regarding this regiment can be secured by calling at the district forester's office, Beck Building, Portland, Oregon, or at any forest supervisor's headquarters in Oregon.

Will Be Sent to France.
It is understood that the various companies composing these battalions will be scattered widely throughout the forests of France, where they will be called upon to cut timber and prepare it in the form needed for use by the military authorities as lumber, ties, poles, pling, fire wood, etc. Officers are already being selected and enlisted men are needed. They should be experienced woodmen and sawmill workers. Service in these units will give such men a chance to take part in the war in the line which their life training and experience has particularly fitted them. For logging crews there are needed, skilled axmen, woodsmen, filers, the sawyers, skidders, teamsters and blacksmiths. For mill crews, millwrights, mill sawyers, circular saw filers, mill engineers and experienced mill hands.

Must Be Between 18 and 44.
Applicants for enlistment must have reached their eighteenth birthday and not have passed their forty-first. They will be subject to the same physical examination as required for the regular army. Men of draft age whose names have been posted by the "local board" for service in the regular army are not eligible for enlistment. Other men of draft age will be accepted. Men with dependents will be required to give a certificate signed by them and their adult dependents, that they will not call upon the United States for financial support during the period of applicant's enlistment. Enlistments will be for the period of the war. All recruits will be enlisted as privates, even though qualified for non-commissioned positions. Warrants for noncommissioned officers are issued if a man is found qualified by the regimental commander, after joining the battalion to which he is assigned.

Pay Begins at Enlistment.
Pay will begin at the date of enlistment. Transportation and subsistence will be furnished to recruits by the recruiting officer. Enlisted men may arrange to have their families receive all or any portion of their pay during their absence.

RED CROSS TO TRAIN HOME SERVICE MEN

Will Have Force of Workers to Supplement Government in Care of Soldiers' Families.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—The American Red Cross held a conference of Home Service Directors today as the first step in a plan to train volunteer workers for home service during the war. The government will assume the care of dependent families of soldiers, but there will be need for other material aid which the Red Cross plans to provide. It will be able to place at the disposal of fami-

lies medical and legal aid, together with advice and suggestion on those affairs which ordinarily are settled by the husband. This is called home service.
Institutes to train volunteers will be established throughout the country. Courses of instruction will last six weeks and will include lectures and practical field work. Membership in the institute will be limited to twenty-five in order to assure adequate personal attention to each student.
In charge of these institutes will be Dr. Thomas J. Riley, general secretary of the Brooklyn Bureau of Charity, and Porter E. Lee of the New York School of Philanthropy. Courses will be held in virtually every city, while extension courses will be arranged for smaller cities and towns.
