TOTAL ASSESSMENT UMATILLA COUNTY TOTALS \$40,367,334

Assessor C. P. Strain has completed a summary of the Umatilla county tax list for the present year and it shows a total assessment, exclusive of the public utilities, of \$40,367,334 whereas last year the amount was \$37,924,138. The wheat assessment this year is lighter than a year ago owing to the fact there was practically no wheat in the hands of the farmers on March 1. The public utility corporations last year were assessed at \$10,866,692 in this county. If the assessment this year should be the same the total assessment of the county will be slightly over 51 millions.
