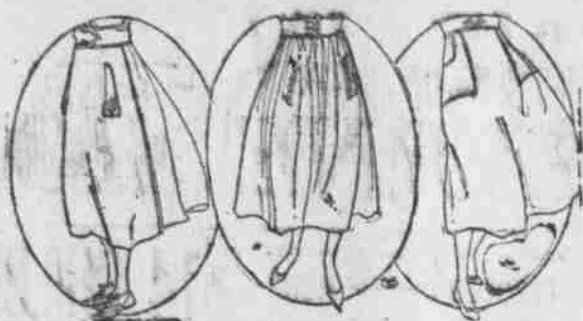

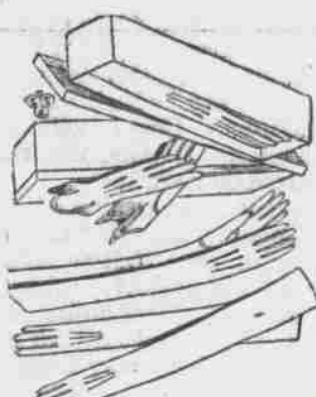

Negro Lieutenant's Complaint to Washington Exaggerated, Inquiry Discloses.

VICKSBURG, Nov. 20.—From information obtained from local authorities and from the father of Joseph H. Sanders, negro lieutenant in the United States army, it appears that the complaint made by Sanders to the War Department is in almost every instance exaggerated.

Sanders told the St. Louis newspaper he had been driven out of Vicksburg after being told by white citizens that "no niggers could wear a uniform in Mississippi that white people had to honor." He stated that he had fled after having been followed by a mob to a negro resort in Lower street conducted by his parents.

His father was questioned today. He said he knew nothing of a mob. When the newspaper statement was read to him, the elder Sanders stated: "He done gone up dar and told dem folks something dat he didn't tell his pa 'bout" (sings), "an' if all dat happened to him I sho didn't know nuffin' about it."

PLAN DRY FIGHT IN MARYLAND

REFUGEE CHILDREN IN PITIABLE SHAPE

PORTLAND, Nov. 21.—First word since his arrival in France has been received from Dr. Charles E. Moore, well known Portland physician, who followed under the Red Cross for service in the children's division abroad.

The saddest sight that has greeted his eyes since he has gotten actively to work, he says, is the return of the "refugees" sent back from territory occupied by the Germans.

The refugees are returning through Switzerland at the rate of 1000 a day," reads a letter received by a friend in Portland. "Only 10 to 20 per cent of these 'refugees' are children and people who have been wealthy before the war and they are pitiful to see—filthy and vermin covered; their own relatives do not recognize them. Enduring has become a science at Evian.

Stories All Reported.
The children's bureau of the Red Cross is establishing a small hospital at Evian to assist the French government in the great task, debarking, bathing and clothing these people and then distributing to different parts of France. Each person's story is carefully recorded and at the end of the war their terrible tales may be published. Imagine having your your food still in before your face for five months—a national health.

TRIES TO ATTACH EX-CZAR'S MONEY

NEW YORK, Nov. 21.—Three million dollars belonging to Nicholas Romanoff, former czar of Russia, said to be deposited in his name in several New York banks, was attached today by Attorney Bernard Baumgardner, on behalf of the Marine Transportation company of New York city. The application was granted by Justice Brandeis.

Baumgardner sets forth that in 1915 his client sold supplies worth \$2,000,000 to the Russian government of which Nicholas Romanoff was head at that time.
