91 SUFF RAIDERS DRIVEN FROM JAIL

Picket Mob Forces Way to Window of Alice Paul, Who Declares She is Forcibly Fed

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—Ninety-one suffragettes, including the forty-one pickets arrested in front of the White House yesterday, packed the District Jail today and, disregarding the orders of the guards, got within speaking distance of Miss Alice Paul, who is on a hunger strike and is being forcibly fed.

From the window of her room in the psychiatric ward Miss Paul addressed the women. "Demand that you be treated as political prisoners," she said to the forty-one arrested yesterday.

"The demand of forty-one of you cannot be resisted. Demand that you be given your books and writing materials; that you be allowed to receive food from the outside and have callers. It is that we are hunger striking for. You will win it for us."

"Oh, reaching the jail the pickets marched in double file up the steps to Warden Zinkham's residence.

"We wish to see the Warden," the leader of the line announced when Mrs. Zinkham came to the door.

"You cannot see him, the poor man is frustrated," replied the Warden's wife.

Then there was a cry from the adjoining building, the psychiatric ward.

"It's Miss Paul. It's Miss Paul," some one shouted, and the women broke ranks and ran across the grounds.

"This is a government reservation," shouted the guard. "We'll send you all to jail for this."

"We'll be here tomorrow, anyway," one picket replied.

One of the pickets asked Miss Paul how she was getting along.

"I'm all right," she replied. "I am being forcibly fed three times a day. It's worse than in England. There they feed you only twice. I am able to prevent them from giving me half of what they bring, but I have not the strength to prevent them from forcing me to take some."

Then the guards were reinforced and the suffs were driven away. Afterward the pickets searched for a window of Miss Rose Winslow, the other hunger striking suffragette. With her they were able to get only a few words. She told them she was resisting the forcible feeding "as she could," but that she was too weak to make much resistance.

"My stomach is resisting however," she cried.

INTERNED GERMANS ARE FED TOO WELL

So Says Hoover Urging That Nations Be Made Same as Berlin Gives War Prisoners.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—Food Administrator Hoover believes the government is spending entirely too much money on food for German prisoners interned in America. He recommended some time ago to the war department, which has charge of most of the internment camps, that the same food be given to alien enemies in this country under guard as that provided by Germany for her war prisoners. The department has not taken any action on this recommendation.

Many women at Asheville, N. C., have refused to sign food pledges owing to the unrestrained appetites of the German prisoners interned at Hot Springs, about twenty miles distant. These women, it is understood, have refused to agree to conserve food, when it is being lavished upon the Germans in such a manner as to cause much harsh criticism.
