IRRIGATION CONGRESS WILL MEET ON JAN. 2

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 22.—The seventh annual convention of the Oregon Irrigation congress has been scheduled to open at the Imperial hotel on Wednesday, January 2, for a four days' session. This was decided upon by a meeting of the executive committee held Wednesday afternoon.

The executive committee consists of H. H. O'Armound of Bend, George Russell of Prineville, Harry Gard of Madras, Ralph Cowell of Medford, J. N. B. Gorking, J. W. Brewer of The Dalles, Joseph T. Hinkle, president, and Fred Wallace, secretary of the congress, met with the committee.

The formal program for the congress was mapped out in a tentative way and will be published in detail when definitely determined upon.

TWO LAWYERS DISBARRED.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Nov. 21.—Samuel T. Crane, Spokane attorney, and James Bruen of Seattle, were declared disbarred by the state board of law examiners today. Crane is found guilty of unprofessional conduct in making settlement of a lawsuit and obtaining money after having been disbarred from the case.

Bruen was disbarred on findings that he advised a woman client to invest \$200 in a mortgage on property already overencumbered. She lost her money. The disbarred attorneys have 30 days in which to appeal to the supreme court.
