FIGHTING MEN TAKE MORE THAN HALF A BILLION INSURANCE

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 2.—The law which provides for Government

life insurance for soldiers and sailors has been in operation a little more than a month. The Secretary of the Treasury announced on November 17 that up to that date \$4,165 applications under the new law had been received, representing insurance in the sum of \$52,922,940. From four to six applications are received each day at the Treasury Department, the amount of insurance applied for sometimes reaching a total of fifty million dollars in a single day.

The law provides that soldiers, sailors, marines and nurses in active service may obtain from the Government life insurance in amounts not exceeding \$10,000 at premium rates ranging from 92 cents a month at the age of 21 years to \$12 a month at the age of 51 years, for each \$1,000 of insurance.

One of the primary objects of this law is to lessen the tremendous burden of pensions which has followed as a consequence of all American wars. It is evident that the administration of this new branch of Government work is big business in itself. There are only one of the many Government activities incident to the war which are adding great numbers of clerks, stenographers, and other servants to Uncle Sam's payroll. Literally thousands of stenographers and typewriters have been appointed in Washington during the past few months and thousands more are to be appointed as soon as they are available. The United States Civil Service Commission is holding examinations for these positions weekly throughout the country. Secretaries of local boards of civil service examiners at the post offices in all cities are furnishing detailed information.
