**GIRL TO PRISON FOR 10 YEARS**

Louise Olivevrau, self-styled anarchist, secured by Federal Judge.

**SEATTLE, Dec. 6.**—Miss Louise Olivevrau, self-declared anarchist, convicted last week on six counts of an indictment charging violation of the espionage laws. Today she was sentenced to 10 years in the state prison at Canon City, Col., by Judge Jeremiah Neterer in the federal court. She accepted sentence without comment. Judge Neterer severely scored her action in circulating literature calculated to hamper operation of the selective draft law.

M., on the western limits of the City of Pendleton, Oregon, by the laying out of gravel bitulithic pavement; such pavement to be constructed and the surface to be finished upon the estate of the City of Pendleton, and all to be in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of Haley street, including the same, which said plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to, and in accordance with the same, and to be further

**Resolved**, that the engineer's estimate of probable cost of such improvement, which said engineer's estimates were made and prepared by Geary Kimbrell, City Surveyor of said city, and which cost is \$194,950, and were filed with the Recorder of said city on the 20th day of November, 1917, and which said estimate and hereby referred to particularly, and be it further

**Resolved**, that the plans and specifications, and estimates for such improvement, as prepared by the City Surveyor, and filed with the Recorder of said city on the 20th day of November, 1917, and which said plans and specifications are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further

**Resolved**, that an Assessment District is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 347, comprising the land to be benefited by such improvement, which Assessment District include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Section 16, Township 3 North, Range 22 E. W. M., corner of the N. W. corner of the 3rd and 4th blocks, thence north 156 feet to the S. W. corner of Lot 1, Block 9, Houser's Addition to the City of Pendleton, Oregon, thence S. 61 deg. 25 min. E. 232 feet to the S. E. corner of Lot 5 of said block, thence N. 2 deg. 5 min. E. 108 feet to the N. E. corner of said Lot 5, thence N. 61 deg. 25 min. W. 23 feet to the N. 1 deg. 35 min.
