Late W. Horace Kerr Was Nation's Leading Expert

GOVERNOR OF COLORADO SAYS THAT IN 10 MONTHS HE HAS DONE MORE THAN ANY OTHER MAN FOR THE STATE.

CORVALLIS, Dec. 14.—W. Horace Kerr, son of President W. J. Kerr of the Oregon Agricultural College, who died recently in Denver where he had been in charge of the Federal Bureau of Markets for Colorado, was said by the Denver Times to have been one of America's most capable market experts.

"His services to the state of Colorado," it quotes the governor as saying, "has been invaluable. He has done more for this state in the ten months of his residence than any other man in Colorado. He was a young man of remarkable ability and his place in the war emergency work cannot be filled."

Horace Kerr was the eldest son of President Kerr and had just turned 30 years. For a time he was business manager of the college but five years ago he accepted a position in the U. S. bureau of markets, since which time he had been in charge of the bureau in Colorado. He was head of a commission in Oregon and other northwest states appointed to devise some satisfactory cooperative scheme whereby growers would get the benefit of the government's information on domestic and foreign demands and be able to dodge the cut-throat buying tactics at one time in vogue.

He was taken with a critical illness about a year ago, but recovered from this and was assigned to the Denver field as his own request. He had good health until business responsibilities were him down so that he was not able to recover from an attack of la grippe. He died Dec. 5 and was buried in the Corvallis cemetery Sunday, Dec. 9, under the auspices of the Presbyterian church and Masonic order. His wife was too ill to accompany the body but upon regaining her health will return to Corvallis where she was at one time an instructor in art at the college.

CUDAHY EARNINGS \$4,430,000.

Packing Company Reports Record Net Income.

CHICAGO, Dec. 14.—The annual report of E. A. Cudahy, president of the Cudahy Packing company, which was made public today, places the earnings of the company for the year ended October 31, 1917, at \$4,430,000. The earnings, the report declared, are the greatest in the history of the Cudahy Packing company.

Last year, the report said, \$87,500,000 was paid for live stock. This year for not more than 10 per cent additional \$129,000,000 was paid, an increase of \$41,500,000.

Gross sales of \$122,000,000 last year were compared with gross sales of \$184,000,000 for the current year, the volume of business, stated in pounds having increased approximately 10 per cent.

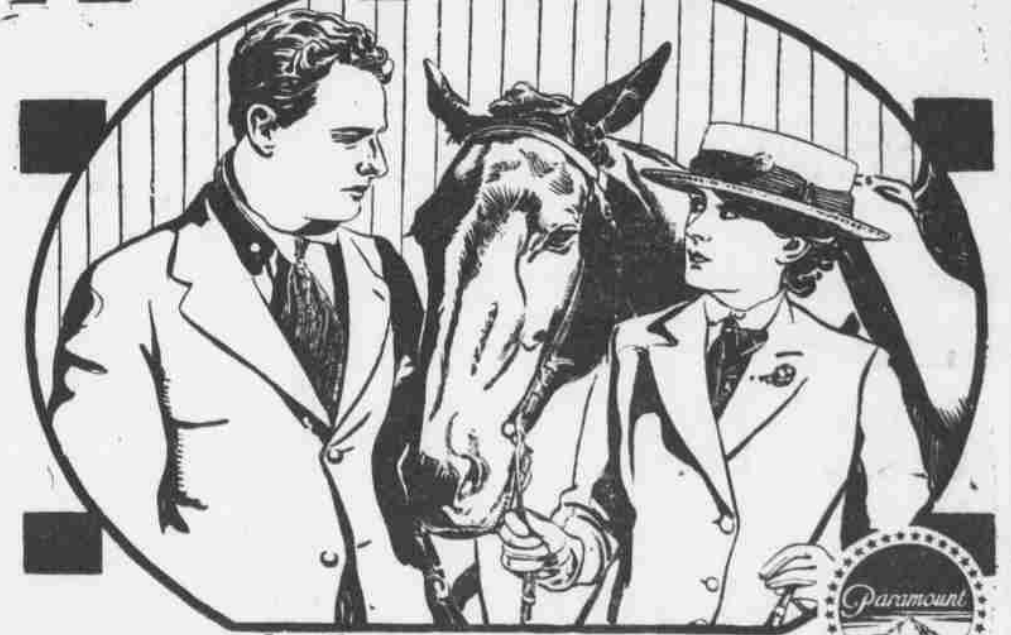
