CATTLE MARKET IS ACTIVE

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 18.—Cattle market showed real strength, and higher prices were forced in the North Portland alleys during the first trading of the week. While there was a rather fair supply of cattle offering on the market during the day, the demand was keenly active, with buyers generally seeking supplies. Early sales of medium grade stuff were made at advances of 25 to 35 cents over last week's figures.

Swine Trade Depressed. It was a very heavy run that was forced into the North Portland yards over Sunday, a total of 2180 head being received. Depression in the swine trade was again general all over the country, with most centers quoting lower figures. At North Portland the week's market started weak, with values 10 to 20 cents lower.

Sheep Trade Steady. Rather liberal and somewhat unexpected run of sheep and lambs put in appearance in the North Portland yards over Sunday, total receipts being 1715 head. Early sales in the alley indicated a general steady tone around former values.
