

# NEWS NOTES OF PENDLETON

### Marriage License Issued.

A marriage license was issued yesterday afternoon to Allen Clay Foster of Long Creek, 23, and Alice Winifred Reed of Ukiah, 25.

### Questionnaires Come in Slowly.

So far only 14 questionnaires have been returned to the exemption board out of 350 sent out. The law allows seven days for the return of the questionnaires.

### Arrested in Civil Action.

One of the most unusual proceedings at law was the issuance of a warrant for the arrest yesterday in a civil action filed in the justice court. The case is entitled William E. Hanscome vs. J. L. Potts which was instituted for the recovery of a diamond ring valued at \$38 which plaintiff alleges defendant contracted to buy of him. He alleges that defendant has refused to pay for the ring or return it and the complaint asked that the person as well as the property of the defendant be held. 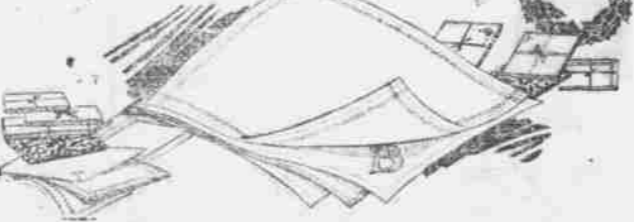

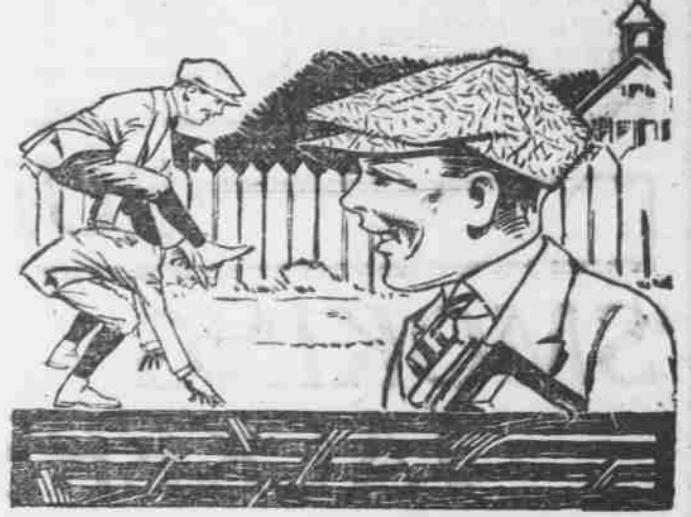
