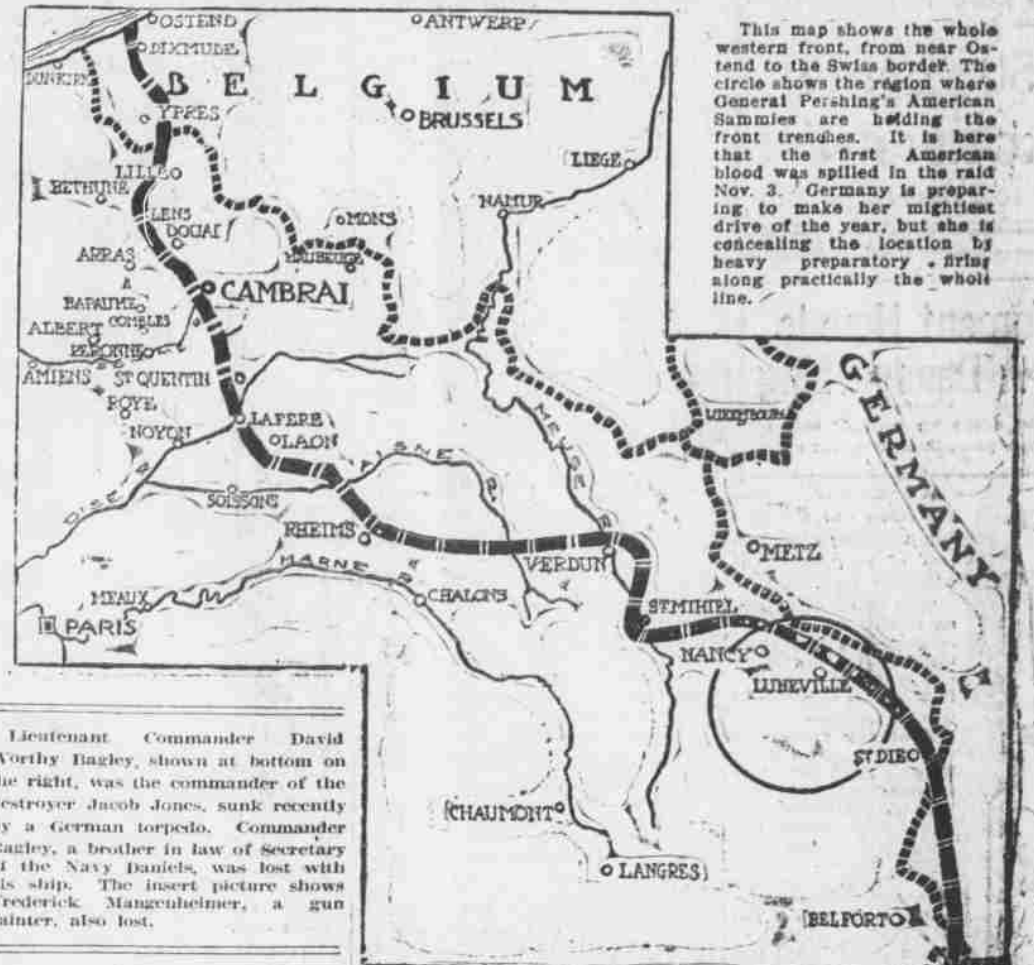

### WHERE WILL GERMANY STRIKE?



This map shows the whole western front, from near Ostend to the Swiss border. The circle shows the region where General Pershing's American Sammies are holding the front trenches. It is here that the first American blood was spilled in the raid Nov. 3. Germany is preparing to make her mightiest drive of the year, but she is concealing the location by heavy preparatory firing along practically the whole line.

Lieutenant Commander David Worthy Bagley, shown at bottom on the right, was the commander of the destroyer Jacob Jones, sunk recently by a German torpedo. Commander Bagley, a brother in law of Secretary of the Navy Daniels, was lost with his ship. The insert picture shows Frederick Mangelheimer, a gun painter, also lost.

The crowd inspecting wreckage (bottom of page) are Halifax folk searching the debris for bodies of loved ones that perished during the explosion and fire.

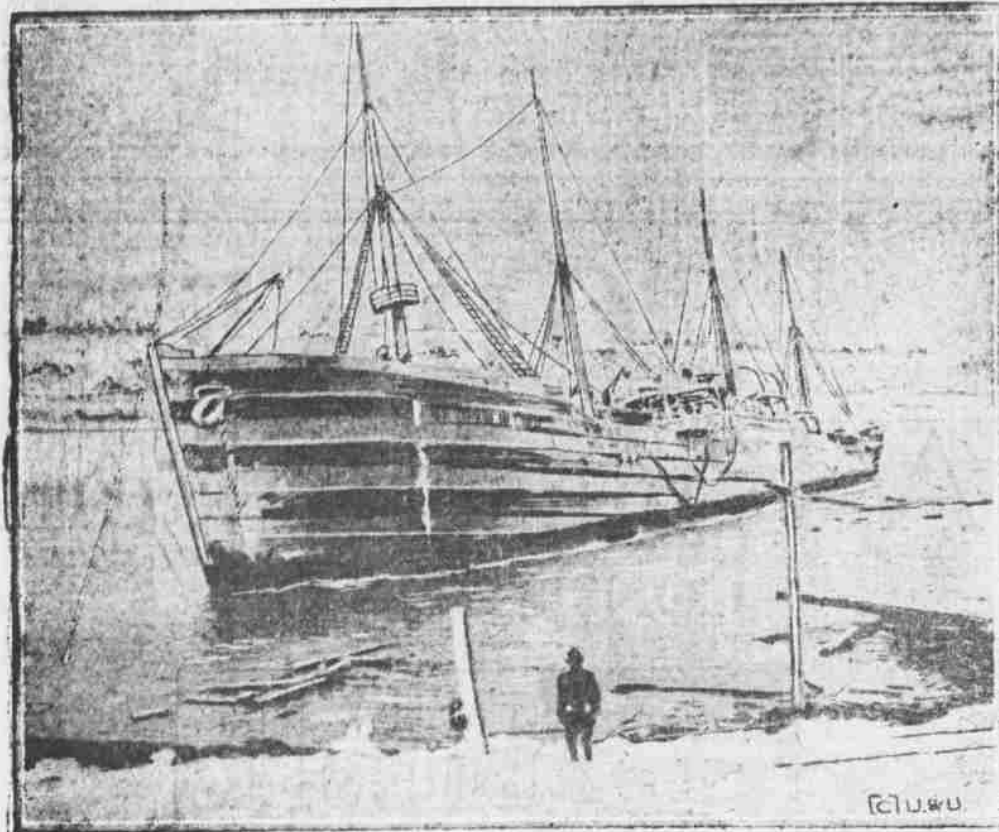
The aircraft picture was taken at an American aviation school where our new aviators are being taught to fly.
