LIVESTOCK MARKET STRONGER IN PORTLAND DURING WEEK

PORTLAND, Dec. 24.—Greater arrivals of livestock were shown in the North Portland yards for the week as compared with the previous six days.

Prices in the swine division were under pressure with sharp cuts in quotations. This condition is the result of the absence of outside buyers in the swine trade. Local killers have taken practically all the hog run at North Portland during the last few weeks despite the assertions of the trade at some other markets that they needed the article and were willing to pay more money than was being here.

The fact of the matter is that local killers were compelled to take practically all hog offerings here because outside buyers would not take hold of current values.

Cattle Market Is Firmer.
Market for cattle showed a firmer tone and higher prices were forced at North Portland during the week. Despite the fact that the offerings were quite fair, killers showed anxiety about securing their requirements. Steers sold at \$10 during the week that were not quite as good quality as had previously brought this price. Quality considered the steer market is again at the high point of the season. While there was an advance in the price of cows during the week, the gain was not as good as in the steer division.

Nevertheless taking the situation as a whole, the cattle trade was excellent.

HOOD RIVER, ORE., DEC. 24.—J. L. Allen, former pastor of the Heights Baptist church, who was arrested Wednesday charged with setting fire to a house owned at Cascade Locks, Ore., bounded over tonight to action of the March grand jury. Bail was increased from \$500 to 1000.

According to the testimony of state witnesses, the house, a part of which was occupied by the family of E. C. Day, including his mother, aged 78 years, the building burned at about 8:30 o'clock on Thanksgiving night.

Allen, arriving from Hood River, according to witnesses, on an afternoon train, left the house in time to take a returning eastbound train.

The owner of the home, Mrs. Mary C. Lee, testified that Allen, when he leased the apartment, had that he expected to work at lumber mills of the town. That later he told her he would use the quarters to study law as well as higher ministry. According to the testimony of several witnesses, the minister shipped two large boxes to the Locks Apartments, stating that they contained valuable volumes of law books. Mrs. Lee said that she investigated the boxes in company with a neighbor who corroborated her testimony, and found them of extremely light weight.

State witnesses testified to Allen's having applied for and secured from the Fire at The Builders' an insurance policy for \$200 on the contents of his apartments. His application recited that he was possessed on the premises of 200 volumes of law books which he valued from \$4 to \$8 each, household furniture and a new \$100 electric refrigerator.

Following the fire the police were retained and no claim was made for any loss.

YARD AND SHIP BOTH BUILT IN 7 MONTHS

Steel Vessel Launched in Los Angeles Which Was Contracted For in May.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—A telegram to the shipping bureau today told of the launching at Los Angeles of the first of eight steel merchant ships contracted for by the emergency fleet corporation at Seattle there. The vessel is of 8000 tons capacity and was ordered May 12 from S. L. Naphtaly.

Turning out the vessel within seven months when the yard in which it was built had to be constructed after the contract was let by bidders by shipping board officials as demonstrating what American industry can do in an emergency.

One vessel contracted for by the fleet corporation already has been launched, but it came from the yards at Seattle which has been in operation for many years.

This country has been launching its new wooden ships. It should send off a few wooden heads into deep water.
