**SWEET POTATOES AND YAMS ARE EXCLUDED FROM UNITED STATES**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3.—Shipments of sweet potatoes and yams from Hawaii and Porto Rico, and importations of the same vegetables from all foreign countries are prohibited after January 1, 1918, by quarantine orders that have been signed by the United States secretary of agriculture David F. Houston.

The quarantines follow hearings held in Washington, in regard to the advisability of forbidding such shipments and importations, and result from determination that injurious insects, not now prevalent in the United States, infest sweet potatoes, and yams in Hawaii, Porto Rico and a number of foreign countries.

MANY PERSIANS DYING STARVED BY THE WAR

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4.—Reports from Persia indicate no improvement in the famine districts, where large numbers of persons are dying of starvation. War conditions have prevented the usual imports, especially from Turkey, and farming has been interfered with by the weather and the occupation of Persian territory by belligerent troops.

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 4.—Emmett W. White, in charge of the Civilian Relief of the American Red Cross announced today that the Red Cross would buy every white mouse in the country. He said:

"We need the white mice for treatment of the soldiers suffering from pneumonia, especially in the southern cantonments. There have been so many cases of pneumonia that the stock of white mice in the base hospitals at the different cantonments has been exhausted. None can be had. We must have them and will try to get them anywhere we can in the United States or Canada."
