### MORE INSANITY IN WAR, STATE EXPERT DECLARES

SCHENECTADY, Dec. 26.—Proceeding on the theory that the best time to treat an insane man is while he is in the early stages of the disease, the New York state hospital are establishing a state-wide system of free clinics or dispensaries for nervous and mental disorders.

At a public meeting on mental hygiene in this city tonight the opening of the thirtieth dispensary, which will be located in the Ellis hospital here, was announced.

Last night's meeting was addressed by George A. Hastings, Executive secretary of the committee on mental hygiene of the state charities Aid Association, who said the country should be made "safe for democracy," as well as safe, both to increase the effectiveness of the nation's man-

power to win the war, and to build up and conserve the mental health of the civil population for meeting the problems of the present and those arising after the war.

"Many people," he said, "are surprised to learn that in this state there are about 38,000 insane persons under treatment in institutions.

"Immorality causes an incurable form of mental disease known as paresis, or softening of the brain. About one out of every seven persons in the state hospitals of this state is suffering from paresis which causes about one thousand deaths a year.

"Alcohol is a brain poison. It is the cause, directly or indirectly of the mental disease of about 8 percent of the women and 15 percent of the men in the state hospitals today.
