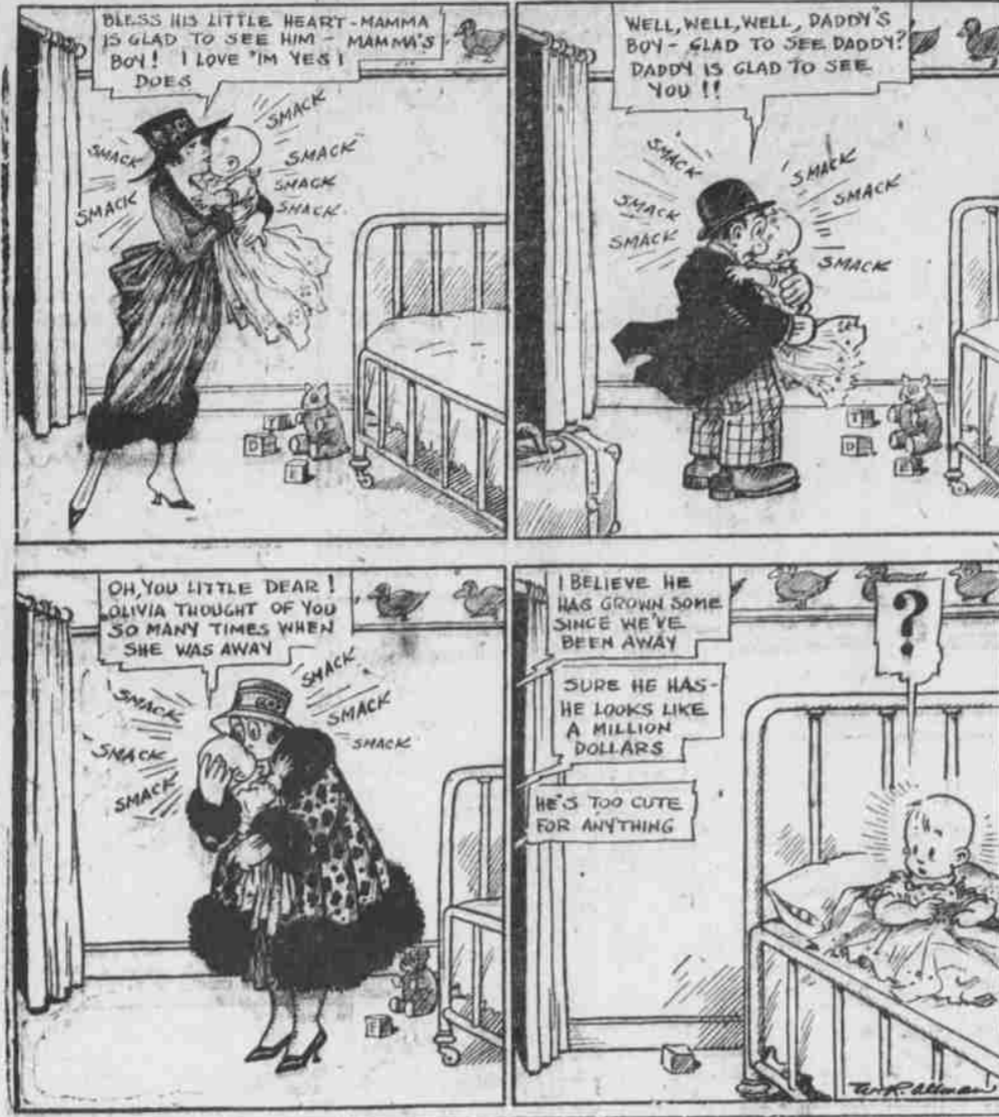

HOUSE WOULD TAX THE PRESIDENT, TOO
Passes Bill Amending War Levies Despite Fight by Longworth.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 26.—The salaries of the President and all the congressmen, were made subject to the excess profits tax of 8 per cent in an amendment offered today by Representative Dillon of South Dakota to the bill putting salaries of members under the tax. The amendment was adopted 5 to 34. The bill was passed 268 to 147.
