OVER THE NORTHWEST

S. B. HOUSTON JOINS RACE FOR SENATOR

PROMINENT ATTORNEY OF MULTNOMAH COUNTY ANNOUNCES CANDIDACY

Has Good Record in Past Legislature and Places Himself to Support all Measures Aiding War.

PORTLAND, Jan. 21.—S. B. Houston, state senator from Multnomah county and prominent lawyer of this city, has decided to become a candidate for the republican nomination for United States senator. The entrance of Mr. Houston into this contest makes a three-cornered fight for the senatorship. C. L. McNary, incumbent, by appointment of Governor Wilbycomb, is a candidate to succeed himself, and R. N. Stanfield, speaker of the house at the 1917 session, also has announced his candidacy for the same office.

Mr. Houston, aged 60, is a native of Indiana, and has resided in Oregon since 1882. The following year he began the practice of law at Hillsboro and served Washington county as a member of the state senate from 1892 to 1896. Removing to Portland in 1896, where he has since been practicing law, Mr. Houston was elected a member of the house of representatives in 1914 and served as a member of the 1915 session. In the succeeding election he was elected state senator and was a vigorous and active participant in the work of the 1917 session of the legislature. He had the chairmanship of the senate committee on revision of laws.

One Delivery a Day. WALLA WALLA, Wash., Jan. 21.—Thirty-six merchants, including those in all branches of trade, announced yesterday that beginning January 23 free deliveries in Walla Walla will

be cut to one daily. The principal houses have been giving four deliveries a day. Merchants received word from the National Council of Defense that this was the only economy reform the national board had suggested, others, such as limited credits, etc., coming from state boards.

Judge Is Threatened. PORTLAND, Jan. 21.—When Municipal Judge Rossman appeared at his office yesterday for the purpose of issuing some search warrants in a suspected case of bootlegging, he found upon his desk at police headquarters a letter, signed "I. W. W." which threatened him and called into his chambers and personally left the message there, as it did not come through the mail.

German Suspect Arrested. SEATTLE, Jan. 21.—Dr. Louis H. Dechmann, who conducts Qui Si Sama Sanitarium in the vicinity of Lake Crescent, Clallam county following his arrest by the Seattle police on Saturday was turned over to federal officials for further investigation. Dr. Dechmann has been among the German residents of Seattle and vicinity who have been kept under surveillance ever since the United States declared war against Germany.

Idaho Farmers Adjourn. IDAHO FALLS, Idaho, Jan. 21.—The joint conference of the agricultural, livestock, engineering and irrigation societies of Idaho, which was in session here last week, adjourned Saturday night with a reception to the delegates and visitors given in the auditorium and largely attended by the people of Idaho Falls and vicinity.

Free Text Books. EUGENE, Or., Jan. 21.—State printing of all school text books and their sale to the pupils in the schools at cost is advocated by W. S. Roberts, of Fox Hollow, who has announced his candidacy for member of the state legislature. The state prints the text books in Kansas and Mr. Roberts says a great saving to the people has been effected.

SCHOOL TEACHERS ARE ASKED TO VOLUNTEER

to perform this patriotic task are the school teachers, and they are now asked to volunteer their services to their respective local boards.

Not Hard or Exacting.

The work will not be hard or exacting. No teacher will be asked to give more than a few hours for a few days. But speed and accuracy are required. The questionnaire of every man who has been classified must be examined and information as to his qualifications for special duties transferred on a prepared card.

A short time ago General Pershing called for a number of trained meteorologists to be hurried to France. The government has a list of meteorologists, but the call was first and the men sent without delay.

Similar calls for specialists in war or lines are being made continually. It is imperative that the war department have a complete and up-to-date listing for example all the carpenters, the mechanics, the blacksmiths, the accountants and so on, so that at a moment's notice the men required can be called out by consultation of the index.

Every teacher in Oregon who volunteers to help in this work should present himself or herself immediately to his or her local board.

Letter from the President.

To all Teachers: The success of the selective service system has been largely due to the reliance that has been placed on the cooperation of all citizens in its execution. In the registration, the election officers of the several states were called upon to perform a specific task, and they performed it unflinchingly and efficiently. Latterly I have had occasion to call the lawyers and the physicians of the country to specific duties and they have responded in a noble way. The time has now come when the teachers of the country can perform a very ne-

cessary task and I have no doubt that they will respond in the same manner.

The process of classification of all men within the field of selection is proceeding rapidly. It becomes necessary to carry forward with this process, the making of a very complete index which shall accurately locate any specially qualified man among the ten millions on our enrollment lists. The local boards are so overburdened with the work to be performed that this task cannot be put upon them and yet the necessities of the nation require that it be performed with the greatest possible dispatch and accuracy. This duty can be performed best by the teachers of the various communities. Under authority conferred upon me by the selective draft law I therefore call upon all teachers to present themselves to the local board having jurisdiction over the areas in which they reside for the purpose of examining the questionnaires and filling out the index cards in accordance with more specific instructions to be issued by the provost marshal general.
