

## SWINE MARKET CLIMBS HIGH

PORTLAND, Feb. 12—Portland climbed to a new high record for swine during the day's trading at North Portland. The price here at \$17.25 for top quality hogs, far eclipsed values in any of the recognized and leading stocky markets of the United States.

While weakness was generally noted for hogs in the east with rather liberal runs, the North Portland market acted just the contrary, demand being very keen and supplies below requirements.

The swine trade reversed itself during the day, preference being given

to light stuff by killers and these commanded a stiff premium over the heavies, while normally the reverse is the case.
