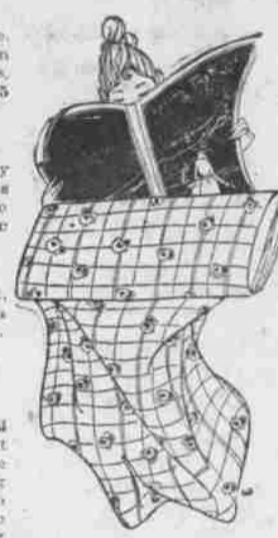

Besides conserving food and furnishing the Marines with special feasts, the pigs consume all table scraps and garbage, thus saving much disagreeable labor. At present the island "ranch" boasts of about 1,000 fine young porkers.

According to the latest reports from France, the Marines over there are adopting pigs and training them to do "kitchen police".
