WASHINGTON, March 19.—William Marconi, Italian Senator and wireless inventor, who has been quoted to despatches from Rome as charging financial War Mission in the United States, was challenged to-night to give names and facts by Francisco Quarone of the Mission, who sent him the following cablegram:

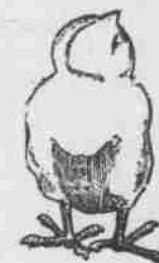

"After your previous utterances you will recognize the necessity of stating names and facts, and I sincerely hope you will do so. This because I have been here spending millions of dollars for our state railways, and also Ministry of Agriculture."

Despatches in the past few months has connected Marconi's name with a movement to have his succeed Count Marchi di Cellere, the Italian Ambassador and High Commissioner. The most recent from Rome said Mr. Marconi had not yet decided whether he would accept. "The Senator declares," the report continued, "he is not willing to shoulder certain financial scandals which have arisen."
