### FARM NOTES FROM THE COUNTY AGENT

M. S. Shrock is county agent for Umatilla County and has headquarters in the Federal Building, Pendleton.

Farmers who have skilled farm hands of draft age can get deferred classification for a time, provided such men are indispensable to the production of the farm.

The United States Employment Service announces that in the new draft for 95,000 men shortly to be called, farmers with experienced help should file with the Local Draft Board an affidavit supported by two witnesses who will say under oath that they are acquainted with the farm hand whose services are asked to be retained and that he is experienced and indispensable to the maximum production of the farm on which he is employed. Do this at once before a Notary Public and file with the local draft board.

This is not intended to help slackers or near slackers to avoid for a time the draft. It is for the sole purpose of increasing production. Farm hands of draft age should be made to understand this. As soon as they are not so employed, the exemption is removed.

### War-Hit Railroad Men To Recuperate in Home In Mountains of Colorado

Railroad men from all parts of the United States, wounded or sick through war service will recuperate in Colorado.

Guy Adams, manager of mail traffic for the Union Pacific System, has deeded forty acres of his summer home on the Double-Header Ranch in a canyon bordering the old stage line to Leadville, and two and a half hours' ride from Denver, to an organization incorporated March 13, 1918, known as the Railroad Men's Mountain Home Association, as a recuperation camp.

Associated with Mr. Adams on the board of trustees are prominent railway officials, members of the judiciary and heads of great enterprises. The plan to finance the project, as adopted by the trustees, contemplates giving every railroad employe in the country, from president to section hand, a chance to contribute. No given amount of money is asked, and contribution in any amount, from twenty-five cents upward, will be gratefully received.

None of the trustees will receive compensation for his services, and the association will be a non-profit corporation. The First National Bank of Denver will act as treasurer and custodian of the funds. All money received will be expended in clearing the land, erecting cottages and providing comforts for the railroad man returning from service.

It is hoped to have the camp in shape to take care of 100 men by July 1, and equipped for 1000 men by January 1, 1919. More than 80,000 railroad men are now in the country's service in the army and navy. While primarily intended for the use of enlisted men who need to recuperate, it is also intended that other railroad employes broken in health shall receive the benefits of the camp. The plan is a most worthy one and should meet with general and generous response from the railroad employes of the country.
