With a greatly growing population and with a far greater demand, due to the stoppage of marketing of eastern swine stuffs, there is a real famine of supplies here at this time.

Receipts overnight at North Portland were fair but scant as compared with the greater demand. Killers are bidding extreme prices for stock.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., April 10.—The army garbage can formerly had a big nose, but now a dog would starve if he depended on the bones thrown from the army kitchen. The plain fact is that bones don't get in to the garbage can; they are sold. According to reports gathered from army posts and stations in the southern department by Col. Daniel E. McCarthy, department quartermaster, one can holds the garbage which formerly filled three.
