Daily Chats With the Housewife

Wheatless Breads for Breakfast
Have you said that you would rather make toast for breakfast than get up a little earlier to make some of these muffins? Do you know that in France there is almost no supply of food ahead and unless we send wheat over there starvation would soon have them in its grasp? Now is your testing time.

Corn Flour and Hominy Muffins
1 cup cooked hominy.
1 teaspoon salt.
1 1/2 teaspoons shortening.
1 egg 2/4 cup milk.
2 cups corn flour.
4 tablespoons baking powder.
Mix together hominy, salt, melted shortening, beaten egg and milk. Add flour which has been sifted with baking powder. Beat well and bake in greased muffin tins in hot oven for 25 to 30 minutes.

Cornmeal Muffins.
2 cups cornmeal.
4 teaspoons baking powder.
1 teaspoon salt.
2 cups sweet milk.
1 egg (may be omitted.)
2 tablespoons fat.
Mix dry ingredients. Add milk, well beaten egg, and melted fat. Beat well. Bake in muffin tins for 30 minutes.

Barley Biscuit Muffins.
2 cups barley flour.
2 1/2 teaspoon salt.
4 teaspoons baking powder.
3 tablespoons fat.
2-3 cup milk (about).
Sift dry ingredients together, rub in the fat, and add the liquid until a soft dough is formed that will fall from the spoon. Drop from a spoon into well greased muffin tins and bake in a hot oven.

Dinners Without Bread
What shall we have for dinner? Well, let's have bread. We'll never miss it. Each of the following menus has much food to take the place of wheat.

I.
Roast Beef Browned Potatoes
Hominy
Cabbage and Green Pepper Salad

Barley Pudding
2 cups cooked rice.
1 cup salmon.
1-2 cup fine bread crumbs.
1-4 teaspoon salt.
1-4 teaspoon perrin.
1 teaspoon chopped parsley.
1-2 egg yolk.
Line a slightly greased bread pan with warm steamed rice having the walls about one inch thick. Fill the center with salmon or other cold boiled fish, mixed with bread crumbs, seasoned and egg yolk. Cover with rice. Cover with greased paper, set in a pan of hot water and bake or steam one hour. Turn on a hot platter and serve with eggless sauce.

Rice and Salmon Loaf
3 cups cooked rice.
1 cup salmon.
1-2 cup fine bread crumbs.
1-4 teaspoon salt.
1-4 teaspoon perrin.
1 teaspoon chopped parsley.
1-2 egg yolk.

Eggless Sauce.
2 tablespoons fat.
2 tablespoons flour.
1-2 teaspoon salt.
1-4 teaspoon pepper.
1 cup boiling water.
3-4 teaspoon lemon juice.
Melt the fat, add flour mixed with seasoning, stir until well blended, then gradually add the water and stir until it boils. Add lemon juice last. Let cook 5 minutes.

SPIKES IN HOGS BLAMED ON I.W.W.

ABERDEEN, Wash., April 16.—Spikes in logs rained two saws, endangered several lives and hindered war work at the Donovan plant Saturday. The presence of the spikes is attributed to either German sympathizers or I. W. W., whose leaders preach sabotage.

In one log six railroad spikes driven in a U-shape were found. When the saw hit these it was torn to pieces and the spikes hurled through the air. The men on the carriage say they were driven deep into the log in order to prevent detection. As a result of striking a spike in another log the mill was closed for several hours, thus lessening its output of ship timbers.

Several mills have had similar experiences in recent weeks. Workers generally are indignant over these sabotage outrages and if anyone is caught in the act of driving spikes into logs he will be dealt with effectively.

Game Warden Will Run Against Taylor

Sheriff T. D. Taylor, champion vote getter of Umatilla county, who has knocked out all comers for a period of 15 years or more, is to have another contest this fall. A new republican hope in the person of Game Warden George Tonkin has challenged the present holder of the shrewdly title and this morning formally announced his intention of giving battle.

DESERTERS CAPTURED AFTER ROBBERY BANK

WILLIAMSTON, N. C., April 16.—Noah Robertson, a deserter from the United States army; Charles Robertson and Clyde Bowen, all young men of Martin county, were captured by posse this afternoon after they had held up the cashier of the Bank of Everetts, at Everetts, near here. In resisting capture, Church Robertson was perhaps fatally wounded. The other two were placed in jail. The robbers got \$2,000 in cash and \$4,000 in bonds, only part of which was recovered. They were masked when they entered the bank and covered the cashier, V. G. Taylor, with revolvers.

Noah Robertson deserted from Camp Jackson, Columbia, S. C., last November and it is said has been living in the swamp in this section ever since to escape arrest.

Crowd at Prague Shows Friendship for America

AMSTERDAM, April 16.—Cheering President Wilson and the entente allies, thousands of people gathered in huge mass meetings at Prague, capital of Bohemia, last Saturday and hissed and denounced Germany, according to dispatches from Prague. Czech, Polish, Croat and Sloven members of parliament and other delegates at a meeting in the town hall adopted resolutions understood to be strongly anti-German. After the delegates adjourned an enthusiastic demonstration endorsing the stand against the German junker class was staged. Foreign Minister Cernin, who since then has resigned, was hissed, and the crowds sang anti-German songs. At Dux, Czech conference unanimously voted to oppose the establishing of a German Bohemian province and gave warning that the Czechs would resist to the last.

TEN ALLEGED ENEMIES TAKEN ON MOUNTAIN

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., April 13.—A raid in which ten alleged enemy aliens, one a woman, were arrested in a shack on top of "Peg mountain," near Peekskill, became known today when Anto Straltz and Walter Enlita were placed in jail here to await action by the federal authorities. The other eight persons who had proved they had registered as enemy aliens, were released. There had been reports that rockets had been discharged from "Peg mountain." The prisoners asserted that they were members of an "open air cult."
