Washington State Organizer Seized by Citizens of Winlock.

WINLOCK, Wash., April 27.—W. B. Edwards and A. Knutson, organizers for the Non-Partisan League of North Dakota, were taken from their rooms here at the hotel about 2 o'clock this morning by a company of 66 representative citizens, loaded into their autos and sent out of town.

The entire conversation was overheard by four witnesses and the facts brought out were such that the citizens felt justified in running the two out of town. Knutson was given a taste of tar and cotton, feathers not being handy. Finish Training Camp. CAMP LEWIS, Wash., April 27.—Two hundred and eleven successful students at the third officers training camp, which closed here last Saturday, have been assigned to the various infantry regiments and machine gun battalions in camp.

The men will all wear the rank of sergeant with the exception that those having high ratings when they entered the training camp will retain them.

HOUSEHOLD

Suggestions for Victory Meals. These recipes will help you to save wheat flour.

Cornmeal Crust for Pies. Grease a pie tin. Cover it with dry cornmeal by shaking with a rotary motion. Have corn meal covering pan to a depth of 1-16 to 1-8 inch. Fill with pie mixture. Bake.

Barley Padding. 5 cups milk, 1-2 cup barley meal, 1-2 cup molasses, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 teaspoon ginger.

Scald the milk, pour this on the meal and cook in double boiled twenty minutes; add molasses, salt, sugar and ginger. Pour into greased pudding dish and bake two hours in a slow oven. Serve either hot or cold with top milk.

Quinque Fruit Meringues. Turn left-over oatmeal into a round mold and cool. When cold, turn out in slices 1-2 inch thick, put one slice in a round dish, put a layer of berries or sliced peaches on it and on top of this another slice of oatmeal. Beat the whites of 2 eggs until light, add 4 tablespoons powdered sugar and beat until fine and glossy. Spread this meringue over the top of the fruit and oat meal, dust with powdered sugar and stand in the oven until a golden brown. (Yokes of eggs may be used to make a custard.)

Barley Hermit Cakes. 1-2 cup fat, 3-4 cup sugar, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons milk, 2 cups barley flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1-3 cup chopped raisins, 1-4 cup chopped nuts, 1-4 teaspoon cinnamon, 1-4 teaspoon cloves. Combine the ingredients as for cake, add enough barley flour to make a dough stiff enough to be rolled. Roll thin, shape with a small cookie cutter and bake on tin sheets.

INDIANS ARE PATRIOTIC

YAKIMA, April 26.—The patriotism of the Grand Ronde Indians of Oregon is becoming proverbial, says L. V. Worthen. They hold meetings every two weeks to discuss the war situation and to formulate plans of local action. Many of the young men have joined the army and navy and the older men are engaged in felling trees and helping out "knees" for ship building. BULGARIAN'S BODY IS PAINTED RED

LAFAYETTE Colo., April 26.—Yesterday morning Mike Dochoff, a Bulgarian miner employed at the Puritan mine in Erie, is reported to have said that there were enough Bulgarians in Colorado to whip the entire United States army and that after the war was over Germany and Bulgaria would proceed to divide this country between them.

This morning Dochoff is in the county jail, with the upper half of his body painted a deep red and suffering from numerous bruises and abrasions inflicted by patriotic fellow miners at the Puritan. Dochoff has not yet repented his disloyal sentiment and if he does not do so before he is released he will be given short shift if he returns to Erie.

Dochoff was seized by the miners at the Puritan and stripped of the waist, after which he was painted. Then his hands were tied behind his back and he was placed on the rear of an automobile truck and driven thru the streets of Erie, Lafayette and Louis and far out into the country districts. Dochoff was kept standing and exhibited to thousands of persons, who either jeered at him or laughed at his predicament. The auto truck was followed by eight machines loaded with miners, many of whom were armed. These men acted as an escort committee to see that Dochoff made no attempt to escape.

Toward evening a telephone message was sent by the committee to Sheriff Dwyer to come to Lafayette and take charge of Dochoff. The Sheriff removed the Bulgarian to the county jail at Boulder. Dochoff may be charged with making seditious remarks.

FARMER IS INSTANTLY KILLED

TEKOA, Wash., April 26.—Francis Berthoff of the Cove, five miles north of Tekoa, was killed instantly yesterday evening while hauling grain. The wagon brake failed to hold, causing it to hit the horses' heels and they began to run. He was thrown in front of the wagon. It is not known if the wagon passed over him, or if he was kicked by the horses. He leaves seven children, four of which are under age.
