SEAGULLS AID ALLIES SEARCH OUT SUBMARINES

(By United Press.)
PHILADELPHIA, April 25.—In regard to the many reports from abroad concerning the part the common ordinary sea-gull is represented as taking in the capture of the U-boat—following the underwater craft is quest of food and "pointing them out" to our destroyers, listen to this " yarn."
Says Frank E. Stewart, president of the Ocean City (N. J.) Fishing Club, one of the largest on the Atlantic coast:
"Every roll on our coast is an aviator in our defense and worth almost as much as a soldier or sailor for our protection. You see, the gulls live chiefly on the fragments of fish left by the hungry tigers of the sea feeding on schooled fishes.
"Every boy on the seashore knows that a diving, screeching flock of gulls indicates a school of fish.
"Like an aviator, they can see below the surface, but they cannot reason that all things under the surface are

not fish. They expect something to appear on the surface of the water following a commotion underneath. That something is food.

"When gulls detect a submarine they follow it like a school of fish, and if this nation ever is attacked by the U-boats we shall be sorry that we haven't ten gulls for every one we have now."

DOING HIS SHIPPING BIT

PHILADELPHIA, April 25.—There is one "king" in the United States, and he is "doing his bit for democracy," William Baker, of this city, is the uncrowned "rivet-king." With his compressed-air steel reaper he hammers into place 1,000 rivets a day on the modern "old ironides" that are being constructed at the Pennsylvania Shipbuilding Company's plant at Gloucester, N.
