### NOT SO BOLD IN 1916

In the United States senate one of the members from Illinois, Mr. Sherman, took up a deal of valuable time that was needed for the passing of measures of vital importance to announce that the President of the United States was surrounded by "fakirs and der-vishes" and that the Secretary of War, in particular, was "half socialist and half paci-fist."

Some attacks on the govern-ment are ingeniously malicious and some are silly. Sherman's is simply silly. He gets no-where with it and advantages his party not a single iota by it. Sherman talks of "pacifists" with scorn. This is rich, com-ing from a man who on March 3, 1916, voted with La Follette and 12 others for the Gore res-olution, partner of the infamous McLemore resolution which would have denied Americans any rights on the high seas that Germany was bound to re-spect. "Pacifist," indeed! Up-on what meat hath this Illi-

noisian Caesar fed that he hath grown so warlike?—Boston Post.

This is no time for a tie-up of the telegraph lines of the nation by a strike. The efforts at mediation should succeed and if necessary to peace the government should take over the business.

If Tom Lawson could have mixed with Pendleton folk at the big auction Wednesday he would have learned some new wrinkles in the way of fren-zied finance.

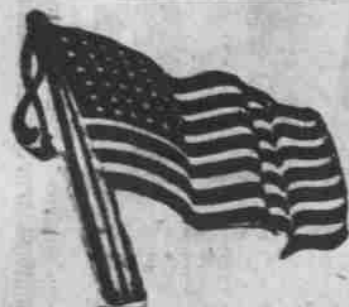

The only path to peace is through German defeat and it must be crushing and complete or it is no defeat at all.
