 PORTLAND, June 12.—Lester McMahon, an employee of the Jones Lumber company, was struck by an outboard Oswego train at 7:15 o'clock yesterday morning on the railroad trestle in front of the lumber mill and died while being removed to a hospital by an ambulance service company.

Man Killed by Falling Tree.
 BAKER, Ore., June 12.—The coroner's jury today brought in a verdict of accidental death in the case of J. G. Cannon, killed by a falling tree at Olive Lake power plant of the Eastern Oregon Light and Power Company late yesterday.

Lightning Starts Fire.
 LA GRANDE, Ore., June 12.—Rain today was accompanied by a severe thunder storm, which came at the apex of heat wave that lasted five days. Lightning struck and ignited a residence in North La Grande, doing some damage to the house. The bolt passed within six feet of the mistress of the house, who was washing clothes at the time, but did her no harm.

14 Year Old Boy a Hero.
 BAKER, Ore., June 12.—Ivan Brudbury, a 14 year old boy, by reaching Nadie and Manley Strayer, daughter and son of Senator W. H. Strayer, with a raft after they had gone beyond their depth in a slough where they were bathing, saved the lives of both children yesterday.

Man 86, Weds Woman 22.
 ST. HELENS, Ore., June 12.—Hessiah Caples, aged 86 and one of the most widely known pioneers of Columbia county, and Ella Hanson, aged 22, for several years past his housekeeper, were quietly married at Cathlamet, it became known here today. Mr. Caples is the owner of a considerable portion of the site of Columbia City, near here, and is wealthy. Family opposition to his proposed nuptial venture is said to have occasioned his secrecy. Mr. Caples himself today gave the news of his wedding.

Blaze in Santiam Forest.
 ALBANY, Ore., June 12.—The first forest fire of any consequence in the Santiam National Forest this year is now burning near the headwaters of the middle fork of the South Santiam river, about 35 miles northeast of Cascade. It is an old burn and is not yet dangerous.

 YAKIMA, Wash., June 12.—The Fruitvale district Grange, near this city, last night repudiated the Non-Partisan League, and also W. M. Bouck, who was elected master of the State Grange at Walla Walla last week.

 CENTRALIA, Wash., June 12.—Pete Loftus, arrested by the local police yesterday, has confessed to holding up Floyd Trumond, of Aberdeen, and engaging in a revolver duel with Patrolman Broyn, Monday morning. Loftus was taken from the city jail last night to the Lewis county jail.
